- 2 On March 27, 2020 the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) was
- 3 enacted. The CARES Act includes an additional \$3.5 billion in federal Child Care and
- 4 Development Block Grant Funds. These funds may be used to:
 - 1. provide continued payments to child care providers in the case of decreased enrollments or closures related to COVID, and to assure they are able to remain open or reopen; and encouraging states to place conditions on payments to providers to use a portion of funds to pay staff salaries;

2. provide child care to essential workers (health care sector employees, emergency responders, sanitation workers, and other workers deemed essential), without regard to income eligibility requirements; and

Issue - Supplemental Distribution of Funds for Essential Worker Child Care

- Pending final federal notification on the availability of CARES Act funding, staff have
- developed a supplemental distribution of \$200 million based on three factors weighted equally:
- COVID related UI claims
 - COVID related cases by as reported by the Department of State Health Services
- Number of children under age 13

- seventy-two thousand kids per day for 3 months.
