

## Media Fact Sheet Hill Country Flooding

Disaster Unemployment Assistance provides unemployment benefits to qualifying individuals who lost their job or self-employment directly due to a major disaster declared by the president. Under the presidential disaster declaration (<u>DR-4879-TX</u>), people in Burnet, Kerr, San Saba, Tom Green, Travis, and Williamson counties may be eligible.

Benefits are paid every 2 weeks.

Processing time for claims is typically 4-6 weeks, depending on the circumstances of the disaster declaration.

## **Eligibility Requirements**

To qualify, someone must be unable to work directly because of the disaster. This includes people who:

- Applied for and were denied regular unemployment benefits.
- Lost a job that provided more than 50% of their total income.
- Lived in, worked in, or traveled through the disaster area.
- Had a place of employment that was damaged or closed.
- Had a job scheduled to start that no longer exists or is unreachable.
- Became the primary breadwinner or support for a household.
- Temporary and seasonal workers: Eligible for weeks they would have been employed if the disaster hadn't happened.

If someone is eligible for regular UI benefits, Texas Workforce Commission must pay those benefits before taking a disaster unemployment assistance application.
