18	Lighthouse for the Blind submitted one product with nine
19	price revision based on quantity and delivery location.

22	MR. MOORE: And staff is recommending
23	approval of all new products and product price revisions.

1	CHAIR HUGHS: And so Item 12, Discussion,
2	Consideration and Possible Action Regarding Approval of
3	Services Offered by Certified Community Rehabilitation
4	Programs Under the PPD State-Use Program. Howard Joseph,
5	good morning.
6	MR. JOSEPH: Good morning, Chair Hughs,
7	Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Thomas, MR. Serna. For
8	the record, my name is Howard Joseph, Program Manager
9	Purchasing from People with Disabilities Program.
10	I have before you Agenda Item 12 for the
11	approval of services. In regards to services there are 8
12	contracts continuing under temporary authority, employing 37
13	individuals being paid above minimum wage. There are 277
14	new and renewal contracts employing 799 individuals being
15	paid at above minimum wage. There were 12 transferred
16	contracts employing 39 individuals. All are paid above
17	minimum wage.
18	Staff recommends approval of all service
19	contracts. I'll be happy to answer any questions.
20	CHAIR HUGHS: Commissioners, are there any
21	questions or comments?
22	COMM. THOMAS: No questions.
23	COMM. ALVAREZ: Nope.
24	CHAIR HUGHS: All right. Do we have a

1 COMM. THOMAS: Move to approve per staff's 2 recommendation. COMM. ALVAREZ: I'll second that. 3 4 CHAIR HUGHS: We are unanimous. Thank you. 5 MR. JOSEPH: Thank you. 6 AGENDA ITEM NO. 13 7 CHAIR HUGHS: Item 13, Discussion, 8 Consideration and Possible Action Regarding Policy Concepts 9 on Amendments to Unemployment Insurance Rules, Receipt of 10 Renumeration (40 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 815, 11 Unemployment Insurance). Morning, Jason. 12 MR. STALINSKY: Good morning Chair Hughs, 13 Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Thomas and MR. Serna. 14 For the record, I'm Jason Stalinsky, UI Policy. 15 Before you today is a policy concept to amend 16 the Chapter 815 Unemployment Insurance Rules. In 2011 the 17 Texas Legislature enacted HB 14, which amended Section 18 207.049 of the Texas Unemployment Compensation Act by 19 providing for disqualification during a claim week in which 20 an individual receives or has received severance pay. 21 As part of passage of this bill the 22 Legislature anticipated that the Commission may need to adopt rules to effectuate these new provisions. 23 Staff has 24 created guidance to implement HB 14, however, it has been 25 piecemeal, and only available internally.

To rectify this situation, staff is proposing 1 2 creating rules to address renumeration by codifying existing practices. It is anticipated that these rules are focused 3 4 on three key areas. 5 The first involves clarifying the definition 6 of severance pay, including the terms income, usual 7 earnings, and negotiated, as used in 8 Section 207.049(b). 9 The second is the creation of a definition 10 for wages in lieu of notice for the purposes of Section 207.049(a)(1). 11 12 And the third centers on defining how 13 disqualifying severance pay and wages in lieu of notice will be allocated to benefit weeks. 14 15 The adoption of these rules in these areas would create efficiencies for staff by providing a single 16 17 location for definitive guidance on these issues. 18 Furthermore, the creation of rules would provide clarity for both employers and claimants concerning how TWC will 19 20 adjudicate renumeration issues. 21 Today staff seeks approval to move forward 22 with the development of these proposed rules as outlined in this policy concept. 23

CARLSON: Thank you. 6 AGENDA ITEM NO. 10 CHAIR HUGHS: 7 Last, but not least, I'm going 8 to circle back to Item 10. Discussion, Consideration and 9 Possible Action Regarding the Report to the Governor and 10 Legislative Leadership Offices Concerning the Estimated 11 Unemployment Trust Fund Balance Pursuant to Texas Labor Code 12 Section 204.061, and the Estimated Employment and Training 13 Investment Holding Fund Balance Available for Transfer 14 Pursuant to Texas Labor Code Section 204.123. Randy 15 I apologize, we left you waiting. Townsend. 16 MR. TOWNSEND: That's okay. Good morning, 17 Chair, commissioners. For the record, Randy Townsend, Chief 18 Financial Officer. 19 Presenting the status update on our 20 Unemployment Trust Fund balance. This will be a projected 21 balance for this coming October. Just by way of review, we 2.2 started the past October with a balance in the Unemployment 23 Trust Fund of just under 1.7-billion. Our expectation for 24 collection is about 2.3-billion from Texas employers. 25 We'll add about 43-million in estimated

interest to that balance, and then when you deduct the estimated payouts and unemployment benefit payouts, which is currently estimated around 1.9-billion, that would leave a balance in the Unemployment Trust Fund upon this coming October 1st of about 2.1-billion. That would put the trust fund balance almost 966-million over the floor on that -- on this coming date. The low-point balance we're estimating at this point in the trust fund will be just under 1.3-billion. That will pay for about 35 weeks of benefits at the current payout rate.

Finally, let me give you the status, also, of our Employment and Training Investment assessment fund, ETI holding fund. We started the year in the balance in that fund, ETI, of 172-million. We expect to add 117-million to that balance. Since we'd be above the floor, we would be able to transfer for the skills program for the fiscal biennium and that number currently, based on the introduced bills for the house and senate will be a 44-million appropriation of the skills program. Taking that into account, we leave a balance in the holding fund of 244-million for this coming year.

Finally, let me just provide to you some of the recent trends. This is back to the Unemployment Trust Fund. Our weekly total benefits paid we're averaging about 38.7-million. This is a 6-week average as of February  $2^{\text{nd}}$ .

That was almost 12 percent below the 6-week average for our 1 2 benefits paid from a year ago. Unemployment initial claims we're averaging 3 about 13,600 or so. It was about even with where we were a 4 5 year ago on the initial claims. However, the unemployment 6 continued claims we're averaging about 115,000, little over, 7 which is about 13 percent below one-year-ago average for 8 continued claims. 9 And, commissioners, that concludes my 10 presentation. If you have any questions or comments. 11 CHAIR HUGHS: Thank you. Commissioners. Are 12 there any questions or comments? 13 COMM. ALVAREZ: No questions. 14 CHAIR HUGHS: All right. Thank you for the 15 update, Randy. AGENDA ITEM NO. 19 16 17 CHAIR HUGHS: There is nothing for Items 15, 18 16 and 17. I understand we have no updates for Item 18. 19 Item 19. Ed, do we have any updates? 20 MR. SERNA: No ma'am. Other than to 21 congratulate the Commissioners on a good presentation at the 22 hearing earlier this morning. All three of you all did a good job. Plus, any time that I don't have to go up that's 23 24 a fantastic job, so thank you all very much. 25 CHAIR HUGHS: Well, you did a great job

1	yesterday, and the fun continues. But I'm glad that they're
2	interested in our agency and the work that we're doing and
3	how they can assist. I'm very grateful for the opportunity
4	to be able to tell our story to the legislators, so that's
5	great.
