22	again. We are back in session.
23	Item 8, Discussion, Consideration and
24	Possible Action Regarding Adoption of Rules Relating to the
25	Vocational Rehabilitation Services Administrative Rules and
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Procedures Previously Published for Public Comment in the Texas Register on January 4, 2019. And it's regarding 40 TA, Chapter 850. Good morning.

MS. GEIGER: Good morning. Good morning
Chair Hughs, commissioners and -- good morning Chair Hughs,
commissioners, and Mr. Serna. I'm Carline Geiger with
Vocational Rehabilitation Division.

During the December 18, 2018 commission meeting the proposed amendments to the existing VR administrative rules in Chapter 850 were approved by the commission for publication for comment. Following the 30-day comment period no comments were received.

Since the transfer of the administration of VR services from DARS to Texas Workforce Commission, TWC was directed to integrate the VR programs into a single program, including consolidating policies and recommending the adoption of any necessary rules. Consistent with this legislative mandate, TWC is proposing to repeal some administrative provisions that overlap with existing TWC rules, proposing an integration of the appeal and hearing procedures that were separate under VR Blind and VR General into a single, consolidated set of rules for VR customer appeal and hearing procedures. And updating terminology, citations, references to ensure consistency with the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act and references to

1	programs that did not transfer to TWC were removed.
2	Other than the updates I've just mentioned,
3	the existing rules were combined and reordered, but were not
4	substantively changed, except for items in subchapter E,
5	relating to the VR customer appeals and hearing procedures.
6	Staff seeks commission approval of the
7	adoption of the rules in Chapter 850. Do you have any
8	questions?
9	CHAIR HUGHS: Any questions?
10	COMM. ALVAREZ: No, ma'am.
11	CHAIR HUGHS: Can I have a motion?
12	COMM. THOMAS: I move to adopt the repealed,
13	new, and amended sections to 40 Texas Administrative Code
14	Chapter 850, Vocational Rehabilitation Services
15	Administrative Rules and procedures as presented by staff.

19	went into putting this together.

Pursuant to Texas Labor Code Section 204.061, and the Estimated Employment and Training Investment Holding Fund Balance Available for Transfer Pursuant to Texas Labor Code Section 204.123.

MR. TOWNSEND: Good morning Chair Hughs, commissioners. For the record, Randy Townsend, Chief Financial Officer. Presenting the latest trust fund projection to you this morning, and we'll also share some recent trends for the unemployment trust fund.

We're going to begin with the balance we started the year with. This where we've been last October 1st, just under 1.7-billion in the trust fund. We're now estimating we'll collect about 2.3-billion in employer remittances, adding interest on top of that of almost 45-million for the year, and then our current estimate for the year, unemployment benefit payments, is just over 1.9-billion at this point.

That would leave a balance in the trust fund, we're estimating, of 2-billion, 153-million, almost.

Comparing that to the trust fund floor, which is slightly above 1.1-billion for the floor, that would leave a balance in the trust fund of just under \$1-billion on October 1st of this year. So, the low point we're estimating for the trust fund is around 1.3-billion for coming this spring, and that would fund about 35 weeks of benefits at the current payout

rate.

Training Investment Assessment, the holding fund we call it, 5128, the balance in that fund, holding fund was about 172-million when we started the year. We expect to add about 116 for the 1/10th of 1 percent collection from employers. After you account for the reimbursement costs that are required from the -- by Department of Labor on that, that would leave a balance in the holding fund of 288-million. Taking into account for the expected transfer of the skills program at almost 44-million, that would leave a balance of about 244-million in the -- in the holding fund. So, again, pretty good shape for both those funds at this point.

I will share with you the benefit payment trends. This is for a six-week average ending April 6th.

That was 36.3-million, 4 percent below one-year-ago average for benefit payments. Initial claims were averaging just over 12,000 for the 6 weeks ending April 6th, and that was about 3 percent below the one-year-ago average for initial claims.

And, finally, the continued claims were averaging just over 100 -- just under, excuse me, 107,000, and that was almost 8 1/2 percent below the one-year-ago average. So, again, the trends are all very positive in terms of where we are in terms of claims and that -- and

Tom McCarty, 4 5 External Relations. 6 At 8:00 a.m. this morning, the House 7 Committee on Judiciary and Civil Juris Prudence held a 8 hearing, and they brought up HB 1975, Chuck Ross was there 9 to test -- as a resource witness. This is TWC's legislative 10 proposal related to removing unconstitutional provision of 11 the Texas Payday Law. 12 We also have three other TWC proposals that 13 are up today. They will be up in House Committee of 14 Business and Industry. HB 1976 by Vo, related to improper 15 overpayment recovery. HB 2242 by Vo related to 16 misclassification in HB 4307 by Vo related to Fair Housing 17 Act amendments. 18 And then, also this morning at 8:00 a.m. 19 there were three bills that Courtney Arbour is serving as a 20 resource witness in the House Committee on International 21 Relations and Economic Development. That hearing also began 22 at 8:00 this morning. 23 HB 3379, by Representative Coleman, which

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would create a pilot program to expand GRS to non-TWC

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childcare providers.

HB 3876 by Representative Deshotel, which 1 2 would create a group to advise TWC regarding the TROs program. And HB 4286 by Representative Yvonne Davis which related to the regulation of childcare providers by 5 6 TWC. 7 Cheryl Fuller is also serving as a resource 8 witness, and the same committee on HB 3916 by Representative 9 Deshotel, which related to the competitive and integrative 10 employment for certain Medicaid recipients. And then, this afternoon, in House Defense --11 12 Defense of Veterans Affair, Bob Gear will serve as a 13 resource witness on HB 4047 by Representative Dominguez, related to the facilitation of awarding post-secondary 14 15 course credit leading workforce credentialing based on military experience, education and training. 16 17 Last but not least, at 10:00 this morning the 18 House HB 1 Conference Committee will begin meeting with both 19 the House and the Senate members, so we'll keep you updated 20 on what they decided to do with HB 1. 21 That concludes my remarks, and I'm available 22 if you have any questions. 23 CHAIR HUGHS: That's a lot. There's a lot 24 going on. MR. McCARTY: Thank you for updating us on 25

1	that. Does anyone have any comments or questions?
