- 5 Texas Human Resources Code Title 40, Chapter 122.0057, requires the Texas Workforce
- 6 Commission (TWC) to establish the Purchasing from People with Disabilities (PPWD) Advisory
- 7 Committee consisting of 13 members appointed by TWC. The advisory committee must be
- 8 composed of four representatives from community rehabilitation programs (CRPs) that
- 9 participate in the PPWD program, four representatives from organizations that advocate for
- individuals with disabilities, four individuals with disabilities, of whom two are employed by a
- 11 CRP participating in PPWD, and the executive commissioner of the Texas Health and Human
- 12 Services Commission (HHSC) or designee.
- 13 Twelve advisory committee members serve staggered four-year terms expiring on February 1 of
- the fourth year. No member other than the HHSC executive commissioner may serve more than
- 15 two terms. The HHSC executive commissioner's position does not have a set term.

16 Issue

- 17 The terms of members Sean Quigley, Brandye Lacy, and Brooke Hohfeld expire in 2019. These
- members would like to continue their commitment to the advisory committee for a second term.
