## PART I. PURPOSE, BACKGROUND, AND AUTHORITY¶

The purpose of the proposed Chapter 803 rule changes is to implement statutory changes related to the Skills Development Fund SDF) program.¶

House Bill (HB) 700, 86th Texas Legislature, Regular Session (2019), amended sections of Texas Labor Code Chapter 303, relating to the SDF program. The bill amended §303.001(a) to add Local Workforce Development Boards (Boards) to the list of entities hat are eligible to use SDF grants as an incentive to provide customized assessment and training.

Additionally, HB 108, 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session (2017), amended the Texas Labor Code to add §303.0031 regarding the use of SDF grants to encourage employer expansion and recruitment. The section allows SDF grants to provide "an intensive and rapid response to, and support services for, employers expanding in or relocating their operations to this state, with a focus on recruiting employers that will provide complex or high-skilled employment opportunities in this state."

Fexas Government Code §2001.039 requires that every four years each state agency review and consider for readoption, revision, or repeal each rule adopted by that agency. TWC has assessed whether the reasons for adopting or readopting the rules continue to exist. TWC finds that the rules in Chapter 803 are needed, reflect current legal and policy considerations, and reflect current TWC procedures. The reasons for initially adopting the rules continue to exist. TWC, therefore, proposes to readopt Chapter 803, Skills Development Fund, with amendments described in this proposed rulemaking.
