1 Tuesday, September 16, 2025 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Good morning, 2 3 everyone. This, uh, meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has 4 anybody signed up for public comment? 5 MR. TROBMAN: [Inaudible] COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Thank you. Uh, let's 6 7 move on then to policy agenda items for today. Uh, this is 8 Agenda Item 3, Purchasing from People with Disabilities Program 9 for Fiscal Year 2026. 10 JUAN GARCIA: Good morning, uh, 11 commissioners, uh, Mr. Serna. Juan Garcia with the Voc Rehab 12 Division. Uh, this morning for your consideration and, uh, for 13 approval are the proposed central nonprofit agency management 14 fee rates for FY26 along with the method of calculation. Section 15 0, 806.31 of the Texas Administrative Code requires the 16 commission to approve the fees along with the method of 17 calculation on a yearly basis. The proposed fees, uh, have not 18 changed from previous years. As required by the, uh, by the, uh, 19 rules, the rates were posted for a 60-day public comment period, 20 uh, no changes are recommended, uh, based on those comments. 21 Staff recommends the approval of the management fee rates and 22 the method of calculation as presented in this discussion paper. 23 With that I can answer any questions you might have. 24 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Thank you. 25 Commissioner Esparza, do you have any questions or comments?

1 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No, I don't. Thank 2 you. 3 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Thank you, Juan. I 4 move that we approve the Purchasing from People with 5 Disabilities central nonprofit agency management fees and method of calculation for state fiscal year 2026 as set forth in the 6 7 discussion paper and presented today by staff. 8 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I second. 9 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Thank you. It's been, 10 uh, moved and seconded and the motion carries. Thank you. 11 JUAN GARCIA: Thank you. 12 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Move on to Agenda 13 Item 4, Business Enterprises Customer Serve, Survey and Cost 14 Analysis Report. 15 CYNTHIA GONZALEZ: Good morning. Uh, 16 Commissioner Treviño, Commissioner Esparza, and Mr. Serna, for 17 the record, Cynthia Gonzalez, BET director. Uh, today I bring 18 into your consideration and approval, uh, the Business 19 Enterprises of Texas Customer Satisfaction and Cost Analysis 20 Report to the governor and the LBB pursuant to Rider 38 as part 21 of TWC performance reporting for the 2024-2025 biennium. The 22 survey covers, uh, state host agency satisfaction with operation 23 conditions of BET facilities located on state agency buildings 24 including hours of operation, pricing, menu items, and product 25 lines of cafeterias, snack bars, convenience stores, and micro

markets. The survey also covers satisfaction with product lines and availability of product and vending machines. This year's survey was conducted in May of 2025 with eight percent decrease in responses. We streamlined the survey, increased outreach to host agencies, and enhanced the ease of reporting by posting surveys prior, flyers with QR codes in each food service location of note. Eighty-three percent of respondents agreed that operation hours are conducted to their daily schedule, 81 percent agreed that facilities make available a wide variety of food and beverage choices, 78 percent agreed that healthy choices are readily available, uh, over 80 percent of respondents rated the quality of food, the quality of service, and the atmosphere of BET facilities at three stars or better. Uh, staff is seeking commission's approvals of this year's annual report for submission to the governor and, uh, LBB, and permission to make nonsubstantiative corrections to the final formatting of the report. Uh, that concludes my presentation and I'd be, uh, glad to answer any questions.

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COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Uh, no questions.

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: I move that we approve the Business Enterprises of Texas Customer Satisfaction Survey and Cost Analysis Report for submission to the governor and the Legislative Budget Board as recommended today by staff.

JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Good morning,

commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, Jennifer Colehower, Information, Information Innovation & Insight Division, and today I'd also like to introduce, uh, Geoffrey Miller who is our director over analytics and evaluation team in I|3. So today for your consideration and approval are the board contract year 2026 child care initial job search success rate performance measure targets, the child care initial job search success rate target measures, the percentage of parents enrolled in initial job search child care and who become employed during the 90-day period of initial job search child care eligibility. I | 3 is recommending continuing the existing board contract year '25 targets for board contract year '26 for continuity purposes as I|3 continues to determine baseline performance for the Workforce Boards under this new measure. So we recommend-staff recommends continuing these targets set for '25 through board contract year '26, and we are available to answer any questions

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1 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Thank you. 2 Commissioner Esparza, any questions or comments? 3 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Yes, I do. Just a 4 couple of clarifying ones for my better-betterment of my 5 understanding. You said the initial job search period was-was it 6 nine days? 7 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Ninety days. 8 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Ninety days, OK. That 9 would have been a big mistake on my part. Uh, so thank you for 10 that. Uh, I do appreciate—this is the initial job search success 11 rate. It's, it's, this is a new metric that we're going to be 12 looking at. I think it's, it's always great that we're trying 13 to, trying to broaden the betterment of, of these programs. Uh, 14 I, and I also appreciate what we're doing that, uh, uh, I guess 15 just get a basic base metric of, of, of a continuing measurement 16 right. Uh, one of my questions was about the definition of kind 17 of sufficient level of employment. I, do we define that or is 18 that federal? 19 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: We set-that's set out 20 currently in rule. 21 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: It's already in our 22 rules? 23 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Yeah, yep. 24 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: OK, I can get that. 25 Uh, had one that I was talking-was we talked about, the exiting

of the program itself. I think that was just kind of, uh, how we, how we view when a, uh, if a family leaves a program, uh, for reasons other than, than not finding a job like if they move away or they change or they pick up in another area, uh, or does that—how does that affect the, the way that we, we view the success rate when people are removed?

JENNIFER COLEHOWER: So right now, uh, when we design the measure, we're really trying to get a baseline, and so the kind of situation that you're describing is, is going to need to be an enhancement. We have a couple other situations that were discussed when this measure was originally being considered, uh, and in those situations, uh, they weren't, you know, they didn't account for many in terms of the denominator or numerator so we're looking at those for enhancement, and Reagan's also here for a question, any of those questions.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Hi, Reagan.

REAGAN MILLER: Commissioner Esparza, Reagan Miller for the record. Uh, this is happening in the first three months of a family's eligibility period.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: OK.

REAGAN MILLER: And so one of the examples was what happens if a child ages out so if they're too old to be eligible for child care, the way the rules work, if a child turns 13 during their 12-month eligibility period, they stay in the program until their next redetermination. So even if they

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   were to turn 13 two months in and the family was in the IGS-IJS
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   period, they would still remain eligible.
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                         COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: OK.
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                         REAGAN MILLER: So we wouldn't need to
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   exclude them from the denominator.
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                         COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: OK, so that wouldn't,
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   that would, that wouldn't lower the, the, that wouldn't lower
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   the target then, right?
