

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

1 Tuesday, October 28, 2025 2 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Good morning, everybody. 3 It's, uh, 10, 10:00. Uh, this meeting is called to order. Uh, 4 Mr. Trobman, anyone sign up for public comment? 5 MR. TROBMAN: Good morning, commissioners, 6 Les Trobman, general counsel. We have one person registered, uh, 7 this morning. Uh, it is on Item number 14 so when we get to Item 8 14, we will hear from our registrants. Thanks. 9 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Thank you, Les, 10 appreciate it. Uh, now turning the meeting over to Commissioner 11 Connett to preside over Agenda Items 3 through 10, so, Mr. 12 Connett. 13 COMMISSIONER CONNETT: The motion passes 14 with the exceptions noted. Uh, that concludes, uh, our work on 15 the Agenda Items 3 through 10. Uh, Chairman Esparza, I hand the 16 meeting back over to you. 17 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Thank you, Commissioner Connett. Thank you, all. Sherri, thank you for keeping us 18 19 organized. We're getting close to the end there so thank you, 20 all. We're going to pause for the shuffle. 21 MS. MILLER: Thank you, gentleman, very 22 much. 23 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: OK, thanks everybody. 24 We're back. Uh, we're going to take up Item 11, uh, possible 25 action regarding local Workforce Development Board performance.

JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Good morning, Chairman, commissioners, Mr. Townsend. For the record, Jennifer Colehower, Information Innovation and Insight Division. Today for your consideration is the discussion paper for board contract year 2026 career and training choices and reemployment and employer engagement measure performance targets and expectations for local Workforce Development Boards. These are also known as the non-WIOA and non-child care measures. For the following measures, the recommendation is to maintain the same methodology and targets used in board contract year 25 for the upcoming board contract year 26, and those, uh, four that would stay the same are Active Job Seeker New Employment Connection Rate, Maintaining Employment Connection Rate, Successful Texas Talent Assistance Rate, and Choices Full Engagement Rate. There are three measures for which staff recommends changes to targets or methodology for board contract year 2026, uh, as set out in the discussion paper, and those three are Credential Rate-all Career and Training Participants, Number of Employers Receiving Texas Talent Assistance and Claimant Reemployment within 10 Weeks. And with that, staff recommends the approval of the targets and methodologies for board contract year 2026 as detailed in the discussion paper in your meeting materials. I'm happy to answer any questions you may have.

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CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Thanks, Jennifer. Uh, commissioners, any questions or comments?

1 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Uh, none here. 2 COMMISSIONER CONNETT: No, thank you. 3 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Thank you for the 4 presentation and recommendations, uh. Is there a motion? 5 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Uh, Chairman, I move 6 that we approve the local Workforce Development Board 7 performance targets and methodologies for board contract year 2026 as described in the discussion paper and recommended today 8 9 by staff. 10 COMMISSIONER CONNETT: I second. 11 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: I also vote yes. The 12 motion passes. Thank you. 13 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Thank you. 14 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: On to Item 12, possible 15 action regarding certifications and recertifications, uh, of 16 rehabilitate programs. 17 JUAN GARCIA: Good morning, commissioners, 18 Mr. Townsend. Juan Garcia with the Voc Rehab Division. This 19 morning for your consideration we have, uh, two CRPs that are 20 applying for first-time certification and three CRPs that are 21 applying for recertification. The two new CRPs are as follows: 22 Hild Foundation Corporation in Texas City and the Veterans 23 Advocates Services and Training in Houston. The three CRPs that 24 are applying recertification are as follows: Goodwill Industries 25 of San Antonio in San Antonio, On Our Own Services, uh, in

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   Houston, and the EB Foundation in Corpus Christi. Uh, staff
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   recommends, uh, certifying the two new CRPs and recertifying
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   three existing CRPs for participating in the, uh, PPD program.
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   So with that, I can answer any questions you may have.

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                         REED O'BRIEN: All right, I think we've
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   still got a couple more minutes here to say good morning, so
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good morning, commissioner, Chairman Esparza, Commissioners Treviño and Connett and Mr. Townsend. For the record, I'm Reed O'Brien with the Office of General Counsel. Uh, Texas Government Code Section 2001.039 requires state agencies to review their rules every four years and, uh, determine if the rules should be readopted, revised or repealed and whether the original reasons for adopting them continues to exist. This process also ensures that our rules are not obsolete, they remain aligned with current law and policy and continue to reflect the commission's procedures. Chapter 806, Purchase of Products and Services from People with Disabilities is due for its four-year review, and before you today for your consideration is TWC's notice of intent to review those rules. Staff requests the commission's approval to submit the notice for publication in the Texas Register for a 30-day public comment period and once the comment period ends, staff will return to present our findings of the review and any recommendations. This concludes my presentation. I'm available for any questions. CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Any comments or questions? COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Uh, none here. COMMISSIONER CONNETT: No, thank you.

CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Thank you, Reed. Is there

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1 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move that 2 we approve the proposed rule review for 40 Texas Administrative 3 Code Chapter 806, Purchases and Products and Services from 4 People with Disabilities and the production or publication for 5 public comment as recommended today by staff. COMMISSIONER CONNETT: I second. 6 7 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: I also vote yes. The 8 motion passes. Thank you, Reed. 9 REED O'BRIEN: Thank you. 10 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Next is Item 14, possible 11 action regarding approval of local Workforce Development Board 12 nominees. 13 PATRICIA MARTINEZ: Still good morning. Good 14 morning, Chairman, commissioners, Mr. Townsend. For the record, 15 Patricia Martinez, Workforce Development Division. Today for your consideration we have Workforce Board nominations for 16 17 Workforce Solutions Northeast Texas, West Central Texas, 18 Southeast Texas. Staff recommends approval on the presented 19 nominees and I'm here to answer any questions you may have. 20 CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: OK. I believe we have 21 public comment, Les, for this item. 22 MR. TROBMAN: Yes, sir. We do. We have 23 Samuel Garcia, uh. Mr. Garcia, if you could unmute yourself and 24 begin.

SAMUEL GARCIA: Can you hear me?

MR. TROBMAN: Yes, sir. We can.

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SAMUEL GARCIA: OK. After watching, uh, the last meeting on the 21st, uh, staff recommended that all board member, board nominees be, uh, be approved as recommended. There was a laundry list of them. Then Commissioner Brent Connett who was appointed less than a month before this meeting on September 26th said I'd be in favor of moving forward on all these board slate of nominees with the exception of West Central Texas. I have some questions I'd like to pose with staff about that particular group of nominees, that's what he called it, group of nominees. He then made the following motion. I would move that the [inaudible] that we postpone consideration of local Workforce Development Board member nominees for West Central Texas and that we approve nominees presented for Cameron, North Central, Heart of Texas, Golden Crescent, Middle Rio Grande, North Texas, Permian Basin, and South Plains. It was then seconded by Commissioner Treviño and made unanimous by Chairman Esparza. I was informed last Friday that my nomination was being questioned, and that's-and when I asked why, I was told by our local board staff that they did not know and they were not given a reason. I watched the video of the meeting, uh, the next day and I also saw the posting for today's meeting and saw that my name had been removed from the list of nominees. As far as I know I'm still a nominee and for another term as approved by our local, local chamber of commerce, and approved by our local, uh,

county chair, uh, excuse me, county judges. They have both signed off on my nomination, and the local staff does not have the authority to withdraw my nomination. I want to know if the commissioners asked about the entire slate of nominees of West Central, uh, and also, uh, not once in this motion did he mention me. I was not mentioned. It was a group. Why am I the only nominee removed? I would ask if there was a discussion between any of these commissioners outside of public meeting that would have resulted in this change. I believe I deserve to know what questions Commissioner Connett had about me or even, or the other two commissioners. I assume that is why I was removed. If it's my qualifications because I will put my workforce employer experience, education experience, and community involve again, community involvement up against any nominee from our board or any of the other 28 boards. I was a 2018 National Association of Workforce Board Small Business Leadership award winner. I was a finalist in the Texas Workforce Commission's Small Employer of the Year. I was a winner of the Abilene Chamber of Commerce Small Businessman of the Year. I'm a two-term West Central Texas Board chair. I was the 2013 Small Business Administration Minority Small Business Champion. I'm a past two-term board, school board member. I have over 30 years of being in business and a countless number of community service roles. If you do not approve-if you do approve the other six, when will my nomination come up for consideration? And is, and

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is, since our board is still in compliance, I believe you should vote for all of the board members as presented at once and quitand not single me out, and I am here if you have any questions because I want to know what is it about me that caused you to take it off. I have a reputation when it comes to Workforce Board and just by the awards that I've won on being a very, very, uh, diligent volunteer, and this is a volunteer position. I've heard you discuss these cases over the last couple hours and you're trying to use facts to determine your, your, the way you vote but when it comes to voting on me as a, uh, to continue on, another term on our local board which I have a great relationship with our board, I don't—I don't have any facts. And so I would love to hear the facts as to why my name was removed and why the other—were the other board members looked at. What, what's the reasoning behind this? Thank you.

CHAIRMAN ESPARZA: Mr. Garcia, I appreciate your experience and service to the board. Obviously, my consideration is West Central Texas is seeing some critical emerging technologies out there and I feel like there's an opportunity and would like the opportunity to discuss with the recommending, uh, recommending authorities there be it the chamber of commerce or the county judge, uh, the opportunities for those emerging, uh, industries to be recognized and to be, uh, to have their experience on the board if that is, if, if, if, there's the opportunity to do so, and, uh, we appreciate

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   your, appreciate your time and your service to the board and
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   appreciate your comments today. Thank you. Any questions?
