### PY 25-26 State Allocations

- PY 25-26 Federal Grant Memo received and contained allocations for the state's Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE) program, WIOA Sec. 243.
- Funds through June 2026

### Federal Legislation

- House Labor-HHS Subcommittee: <u>FY 26 Appropriations bill</u>
  - Mark-up for Administration's Budget Proposal
- Notable proposed cuts or eliminations:
  - Eliminates WIOA Youth funding;
  - Combines WIOA Adult and Disclosed Worker funding with reduction in overall funding;
  - Eliminates WIOA Title II Adult Education funding;
  - Eliminates the Senior Community Service Program;
  - Eliminates Reentry Employment programs;
  - Reduces Job Corps by 50%; and
  - Reduces the maximum Pell Grant by \$1,060.

### Federal Legislation

- House Labor-HHS Subcommittee: <u>FY 26 Appropriations bill</u>
  - Mark-up for <u>Administration's Budget Proposal</u>
- Notable proposed changes:
  - Provides funding to support the goal of creating over one million new apprenticeships;
  - Provides funding to grow the American cybersecurity workforce;
  - Increases funding for special education, charter schools, and career and technical education; and
  - Increases funding to support students with disabilities at specialized schools.

### Notice of Interpretation

- Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (<u>PRWORA</u>)
  - limits eligibility for "federal public benefits" to only U.S. citizens, U.S. noncitizen nationals, and certain categories of "qualified aliens."
- Updated <u>notice of interpretation</u>, issued July 11, 2025, from the Department of Education
  - Two critical points of change for verification of eligibility:
    - Develop a process to check legal immigration status
    - Ensure students are allowed to benefit from federally funded programs

### Sample Indicators:

- Increase AEL participant utilization of support services through community partners.
- Increase the number of AEL program referrals received from Workforce Solutions Offices, nonprofits, faith-based organizations, and libraries through targeted outreach.
- Increase the percentage of AEL students co-enrolled in WIOA Title I, II, or IV programs by tracking through shared data systems and reporting between partnering agencies.
