Registered Apprenticeship: How to Start a Program in Texas

	Find sponsors and partners and stay connected with our TWC experts. Learn more about program sponsors at www.apprenticeship.gov/help/what-apprenticeship-program-sponsor . If you already have a sponsor, keep building your network. If you do not have a sponsor, look for others who have similar goals to create or expand apprenticeships. Work together to find a sponsor and build a network of support.

	☐ The program is industry led.	Apprentices are paid employees.	
	The program offers on-the-job learning and mentorship.	☐ The program has an education component.	
	Apprentices receive proper training and supervision to be safe.	Apprentices earn a nationally-recognized credential within their industry.	
	 Work with TWC to review occupation titles and training standards approved by the DOL. When reviewing, decide if the standards meet your needs, the standards need a few changes, or new standards need to be developed. You can change existing standards by up to 25%. If you need to change them more than that, new standards must be developed. 		
	Create a training plan that includes on-the-job training and educational instruction.		
	Find a training provider for your related instruction or provide your own. Training can be in a classroom or online. It can be delivered offsite or at your workplace.		
	Create a wage schedule for the apprentice, including entry-, mid-, and exit-level wages.		
	Complete the DOL registration process with the assistance of TWC's Office of Apprenticeship.		
	Once standards are approved by DOL, launch and manage your program. Visit www.apprenticeship-program/launch for details. • Management includes DOL reporting. Visit www.apprenticeship.gov/help/what-rapids to learn more.

	Complete TWC's online training on fiscal requirements. This training will show you how to receive he funding.
