Subject: Prekindergarten Partnerships

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This Technical Assistance (TA) Bulletin provides Local Workforce Development Boards (Boards) with guidance on actions that Boards may take to support prekindergarten (pre-K) partnerships, including implementing Texas Labor Code \\$302.00436 and indicating which child care providers have pre-K partnerships in the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) child care case management system, Texas Child Care Connection (TX3C).

Background

In 2023, the Texas Legislature added <u>§302.0051</u> to the Texas Labor Code, which requires TWC to administer a pre-K partnership program through the passage of House Bill (HB) 1615, 88th Texas Legislature, Regular Session (2023).

The TWC Pre-K Partnership Program helps eligible child care providers and local education agencies (LEAs), such as school districts and open-enrollment charter schools, to establish pre-K partnerships (which are also referred to as early learning partnerships).

TWC issued <u>WD Letter 02-20</u>, titled "Prekindergarten Public-Private Partnerships and Wraparound Child Care," on January 8, 2020. WD Letter 02-20 describes the implications of pre-K partnerships for Boards and provides guidance on wraparound services, blended payment rates, and additional instructional days. Additionally, Texas <u>Labor Code §302.00436</u> requires Boards to notify the LEAs in their local workforce development areas (workforce areas) about opportunities to establish pre-K partnerships with local child care programs.

A pre-K partnership is a collaboration between an LEA and a quality-rated child care program to provide high-quality care and education to eligible three- and four-year-old children. Partnerships may be either formal or informal.

Formal pre-K partnerships are those in which children are dually enrolled in public school pre-K and an eligible child care program. These children receive pre-K instruction and wraparound care (the hours before and after pre-K instruction) in one setting, typically in a qualified child care program. Texas Education Code \$29.171 defines an "eligible child care program" as a provider that:

- is licensed and in good standing with the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS);
- is accredited by a research-based, nationally recognized, and universally accessible accreditation system approved by the Texas Education Agency (TEA);
- is Texas Rising Star Three- or Four-Star certified;
- is a Texas School Ready participant;
- has an existing partnership with a school district to provide a pre-K program not provided under Subchapter E-1 of Texas Education Code §29.153; or
- is accredited by an organization that is recognized by the Texas Private School Accreditation Commission.

Additionally, a formal partnership providing pre-K instruction to children who are four years old or older must comply with the program standards required for high-quality pre-K instruction as defined in Texas <u>Education Code §29.1532</u>. For more information on formal partnerships, visit the TEA <u>Early Learning Partnerships</u> website.

Child care providers and LEAs may also establish informal pre-K partnerships in which LEAs and child care programs share resources and information. This may include professional learning opportunities, progress monitoring, and curriculum. Children are not dually enrolled in informal partnerships; therefore, funding is not passed through the LEA to the child care program.

TWC Pre-K Partnership Staff

The TWC Pre-K Partnership department is composed of two state-level staff members (a state coordinator and an assistant state coordinator) and 11 regionally located staff members. The Pre-K Partnership department serves as a resource to support and expand pre-K partnerships throughout the state. This includes the following services:

- Informing and engaging potential partners to let them know of the opportunity to establish a pre-K partnership
- Bringing interested entities together and helping them establish a partnership that best meets the needs of their programs and the families they serve
- Assisting providers with the application process for the \$25,000 award for new eligible pre-K partnership classrooms
- Providing guidance for partnership sustainability
- Coordinating efforts with stakeholders such as Boards and Education Service Centers

Recommendations: Texas Rising Star Programs

Each Board is required to inform LEAs about the opportunity to establish pre-K partnerships with child care providers in the Board's workforce area annually. The TWC Pre-K Partnership department may help Boards identify LEAs located in their workforce areas. As part of this notification, Boards should provide LEAs with a list of child care programs in their workforce areas that are Texas Rising Star Three- and Four-Star certified. These programs are eligible to establish a pre-K partnership with an LEA under Texas Education Code §29.171 and may be eligible to apply for TWC's Pre-K Partnership Classroom Award, which assists providers with certain costs associated with a new pre-K partnership classroom.

Recommendations: Pre-K Training Materials and Data

The TWC Child Care & Early Learning (CC&EL) Division provides online resources for Boards seeking more information about how pre-K partnerships may help them meet the needs of families in their workforce areas.

TWC's <u>Prekindergarten Partnerships</u> web page provides an overview of the Pre-K Partnership department and relevant resources, including:

- a three-part video series about pre-K partnership financial modeling for LEAs; and
- statewide early childhood education data spreadsheets organized by workforce area with information on public school pre-K enrollment and kindergarten readiness for previous school years.

Additionally, TWC will provide Boards with a list of formal pre-K partnerships that have been established with the support of TWC in each Board's workforce area once a year. This list will be distributed to Boards via email.

Recommendations: TX3C


TWC recommends that Board staff members indicate in TX3C all child care providers that have secured a signed pre-K partnership agreement with an LEA. It is recommended that Board staff members make updates on an ongoing basis as partnerships are established, modified, and/or renewed.


The screenshot below shows where the partnership flag appears in TX3C under the **Provider** navigation menu section's **Provider** tab.

Boards must ensure the effective date and all required field information are entered. Staff members choose **Select** in the **Flags** field to select the appropriate partnership.




Staff members may indicate whether the partnership is pre-K (Pre_k_prtnr_age3_flag or Pre_k_prtnr_age4_flag) or Head Start/Early Head Start (Hdstrt_prtnr_flag) in the Flags field by checking the appropriate box. Staff members select **OK**, then select **Save** at the top of the **Provider** screen.






To specify the LEA the provider partnered with, staff members navigate to the **Provider** navigation menu section's **Notes** tab as seen in the screenshot below. Staff members select **New**.



Staff members enter LEA details in the **Note Type:** drop-down menu into the **Notes** field and select **General** for **Type**. When notes are entered, staff members select **Save** at the top of the page.



Recommendations: Texas Child Care Availability Portal

TWC recommends Boards encourage child care programs in the Boards' workforce areas to update the **Texas Child Care Availability Portal**, now located on the <u>TX3C</u> web page, with the programs' openings, including those in three- and four-year-old classrooms. This public site may be viewed by anyone and can help families and LEAs find high-quality child care programs in their workforce area.
