4 5 6 7	Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) Rule §800.58 requires the TWC's three-member Commission (Commission) to allocate funds available for child care services to each Local Workforce Development Board based on a needs-based formula. The formula prescribed by rule includes the relative proportion of the following factors:
8 9 10 11	 children under the age of five years old; total number of people residing the workforce area whose income does not exceed 100 percent of the poverty level; children under the age of 13 years old; and
12 13	• children under the age of 13 years old in families whose income does not exceed 150 percent of the poverty level.
14 15 16 17	TWC receives these demographic factors annually from the Texas Demographic Center at the University of Texas San Antonio. Every year TWC uses the most recent year's demographic factor data to develop the upcoming year's child care allocation which must then be approved by Commission.
18 19 20 21 22 23	Issue Federal discretionary Child Care funding increased substantially in late 2018 and has continued at higher levels. Due to this increased funding, TWC has increased the child care allocations made to workforce areas. Boards have in turn increased the number of children served per day. The sudden and significant increase in funding has raised a need for better planning information and more measured application of demographic data.
24 25 26 27 28	Changing the allocation methodology to use a three-year average would allow workforce areas to smooth any gains or losses in their allocated child care funds over a three-year period versus a one-year period. Using a three-year average would also allow for the development and distribution of planning estimates or allocations sooner to help Boards manage the necessary increases or decreases in children severed.
29 30 31 32	Decision Point(s) Staff seeks direction on use of the most recent three-year average of child care demographic factors versus the use of only the most recent year's demographic factors for Board Contract Year 2021 child care allocations and planning estimates
