TOWNSEND: Good morning, Chair Hughs,

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Commissioner Alvarez. For the record, Randy Townsend, Chief Financial Officer.

Recently the Workforce Commission was notified, as other states were as well, that there were some, what's called, restoration of Department of Labor funds for WIOA, particularly adult and youth. So we have taken a look at that, what that requires us to do in terms of ensuring that the allocations are made at 85 percent of the state's allotment for the -- particularly for the WIOA Adult and WIOA Youth.

And so, in your notebook this morning, we've run those allocations with those new amounts. we're adding 154,956 to the total allocations for the adult portion and we are adding 197,467 to the youth. And that has been -- allocations have been run based on the formulas for both of those programs and that has been -- will be shared with each of the board areas once this is approved.

And so, with that, I'll see if you have any questions or comments this morning regarding these two allocation amounts.

COMM. ALVAREZ: No questions, Madam Chair.

CHAIR HUGHS: Thank you.

MR. TOWNSEND: Okay. And if you'll --

CHAIR HUGHS: Are you ready for us to proceed

25 with a vote?

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MR. TOWNSEND: Ready for -- ready for you to 1 2 approve that. 3 CHAIR HUGHS: Okay, great. Is there a motion, then? 4 5 COMM. ALVAREZ: Yes, ma'am. I move that we 6 approve the proposed order revising the Block Grant 7 allocations for Fiscal Year 2019 to Title I WIOA Adult and 8 Youth as described by staff. 9 CHAIR HUGHS: And I second that motion. 10 We're unanimous. AGENDA ITEM NO. 9 11 12 CHAIR HUGHS: That brings us to Item 9, 13 Discussion, Consideration and Possible Action Regarding the 14 Fiscal Year 2020 Initial Budget Entries for the Workforce, 15 Reporting, Accounting and Procurement System. 16 MR. TOWNSEND: Good morning again, Chair 17 Hughs and Commissioner Alvarez. Again, for the record, 18 Randy Townsend, Chief Financial Officer. 19 Presenting this 2020 Initial Budget, which is 20 also considered to be the General Appropriation Act amounts 21 that have been approved for the Workforce Commission's 2020 22 budget, we will spend some more time later this summer working through any operational budget changes that might be 23 appropriate, but this morning this would -- presenting for 24 25 you the amounts that would be included in our accounting

system so that we can move forward through the summer with work that's necessary to begin the state fiscal year on September 1st.

So just by way of recap, I will highlight the amounts that are included in our 2020 Initial Budget. The total of the budget would be 1,934,161,456. Of that total, about 84 percent of that is made up of federal funds, a little over 1.6-billion. General Revenue constitutes about 10 percent of the total budget, about 195-million, and then the other amounts are from inter-agency contract receipts or General Revenue dedicated amounts for the remaining 6 percent of the budget.

Most of the General Revenue that's appropriated to the agency is for General Revenue match our maintenance of effort. That amount represents close to 78 percent of the General Revenue of the 195-million of General Revenue.

Predominately the funding is actually, there's about 69 percent that is made available through grant pass-through funds. Almost 1 -- a little over 1.3-billion of the 1.9. Salaries make up about 240-million of the budget as proposed this morning, and 12 percent of the total budget, and then client services, mostly in our Voc. Rehab Program, are estimated at about 168-million, or almost 9 percent of the budget.

There is a Capital Budget section in here, and I'll bring that to your attention on exhibit 4, I believe, exhibit 4 for the Capital Budget, which is a total capital budget for the -- for the 2020 year of 100 -- almost 108-million. Most of that is federally funded, 98 percent.

On that schedule I lay out for you, within each of the Capital Budget appropriation items, the amounts that are made up with our -- identified with our, what we call, a track number. A particular project within that Capital Budget. What you might notice on that page, I've highlighted for you the Capital Budget items that were approved as our exceptional item requests from this past year, past session; 40-million for the UI replacement, 18.8-million for the Workforce case management, and then the eligible training provider, or career school database, at just under 1.2-million.

I will note that on the repair on rows 10 trough 18 of that page, exhibit 4, repair and rehab of buildings, that was our preliminary listing of projects that were identified by facilities' staff. I will tell you, talking with Glenn Neal about this, I know he's going through a detailed review of all our building needs, and so some of this may -- the priorities may shift on this as we develop the operating budget. So I did want to just give you that heads-up that there could be some future

modifications to those amounts.

And I believe with that -- there's several schedules included in it, so you can look at the additional information I highlighted for you this morning. But this will, I think, get us started for what we're needing for the 2020 year. And with that I'll see if you have any questions or comments.

CHAIR HUGHS: Thank you. Commissioner Alvarez?

COMM. ALVAREZ: No comments.

CHAIR HUGHS: Okay. Thank you for putting this together. I know we're trying to get ahead of the end of the year and that we'll have more thorough, robust discussions on some of the items that we look at for future approval. But I think that all this makes a lot of sense, and certainly support the effort. Is there a motion?

COMM. ALVAREZ: Yes, ma'am. I move that we allow finance to move forward with loading the Fiscal Year 2020 Initial Budget into the accounting system as described by staff.

CHAIR HUGHS: And I second the motion. We're unanimous. Thank you. And apologies to everyone. I'm suffering from allergies this morning. So, if I look a mess, it's why. Anyway, there is nothing for Items 10 and 11.
