Chairman Daniel (00:29:10)	Item 8: Discussion consideration and possible action regarding adult education and literacy performance funding benchmarks for program year 2019 through 2020.
Fabiana Ramirez (00:29:27)	Good morning, Chair Daniel, Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson and Mr. Serna. For the record, my name is Fabiana Ramirez, Program Specialist with Adult Education and Literacy. TWC Rule Chapter 800.68 provides that TWC set performance accountability benchmarks that AEL grant recipients must meet in order to access up to 10% of their allocated funding. On April 30, the Commission approved allocations for AEL program year 19-20 which included the holdback for performance base funding totally nearly 1.5 million dollars. The commission has established a performance-based criterion for this holdback. Additionally, House Bill 1949 which passed this past 86 Legislature Session Legislative Session introduces the measure related to enrollment and credential achievement performance in high school equivalency or ability to benefit programs, which must now be included as part of performance-based funding criteriaPer Criteria for performance-based criteria outlined in your notebook materials are as follow follows: Both Categories A and B are similar to criteria from previous AEL program years. Category A will allow grant recipients to access 33.33% of program year 19-20 performance-based funding allocation for the remaining 65% of total participants served by the end of the second quarter. Category B allows grant recipients to access the remaining 66.67% of this allocation for meeting measurable skills gains target. Category C criteria implements HB1949 as provided in statute and will be awarded to current recipients out of program year 2020



	funds as designated by the Commission after the end of the first quarter in the next program year. Category D provides that staff will make future recommendations to the Commission for capacity building milestones towards meeting HB1949 for implementation during program year –19 2019. Today, staff seeks direction on identifying and assigning criteria for Categories A and B for grant recipients to access performance-based funding for program year 2019 to 2020 and assigning criteria for Category C in order to implement HB 1949. With that, I am available to answer any questions you may have.

As you know, TWC implemented a new work in Texas system going on about 7 weeks ago now and the system has proven to be very popular with a lot of our users, especially employers and the job seekers, but on the back end, there are certain data differences between the way that the new system works and the way the old system works and it is making it difficult for us to kind of run this measure that counts the numbers of employers receiving workforce assistance consistently across the period, meaning the pre/old WIT, post/new WIT (00:33:34) data. We are going to get it resolved eventually, but given the timeframe we are working on for year end reporting, we are making a recommendation to change the performance period backwards. So sliding it from what would have been October through September back to August through July so that we have 12 complete months of data from the same system and, therefore, it's an apples to apples comparison and coupled with that we could take a weighted average of the target from last year and this year in order to scale expectations appropriately and the discussion paper shows how that would work on
