5	The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) allocates federal funding for child care services from
6	the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) to local workforce development areas (workforce
7	areas). For a portion of the CCDF funding, Local Workforce Development Boards (Boards) are
8	required to secure and submit local matching funds to TWC in accordance with federal
9	regulations and TWC Chapter 809 Child Care Services rules and TWC Chapter 800 General
10	Administration rules.
11	Issue
12	Boards submit annual local match pledges from private and public entities to secure federal child
13	care funds pursuant to §809.17 and to maximize resources for child care needs in the community.
14	care rands parsuant to $\frac{9007.17}{2}$ and to maximize resources for emit care needs in the community.
15	Supporting documents include twenty-four (24) Board Contract Year 2022 (BCY'22) match
16	agreements from nine (9) Boards (Borderplex, Central Texas, Coastal Bend, Dallas County,
17	Golden Crescent, Lower Rio, Panhandle, Permian Basin, and Texoma).
18	
19	Boards have secured 20.58 percent of the statewide child care local match target for BCY'22
20	with eight (8) Boards securing at least 50 percent of their target, and four (4) Boards securing
21	Match.

24	Staff seeks direction on accepting child care pledges for donations, transfers, and certifications of
25	expense for BCY 22 in the amount of \$5,193,299.
