

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

Tuesday, January 12, 2021 1 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. Good morning, all. 2 3 This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for 4 public comment? 5 MR. TROBMAN: Morning, Commissioners. We did receive one request for public comment. Cassandra Camargo. You're on the 6 7 line. If you could unmute yourself and introduce yourself for the record. I'm not sure if Ms. Camargo has been able to join us. And that was our only 8 request for comment this morning. 9 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. Thank you, Mr. 10 11 Trobman. Morning, Ms. Miller. 12 MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir. 13 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. That brings us to the agenda items three through seven. Mr. Trobman, am I understanding that our 14 15 commenter has (unintelligible) meeting? 16 MR. TROBMAN: Yes. Chairman, Commissioners, I 17 believe that Ms. Camargo has joined the meeting. Ms. Camargo, if you are 18 able to unmute yourself, introduce yourself for the record and provide your comment. 19 20 MS. CAMARGO: Hi. This is Cassandra Camargo. 21 MR. TROBMAN: Good morning. 22 MS. CAMARGO: Good morning, how are you? 23 MR. TROBMAN: Go ahead, yes, good morning. Doing well, please proceed. 24 25 MS CAMARGO: Okay. I wanted to speak on behalf of

the TRS, changes that we have coming up. We've got a couple of different

issues that we're having with that. We're having, you know, the pre-star. If we have to do the pre-star, does that mean that we come off of TRS? Does it mean that we come off of CCS and lose our CCS contract if we have that issue? Like, say some of the--sorry. Some of the items that are on that pre-star registration list, like, say for example, they've got CPR and first aid on there. There may be a, you know, you've got a new employee that may have fell through the cracks. It was an accident, it was oversight and you get that citation, that automatically takes you off of that pre-star, which then loses your funds. And so if we lose our funding, do we also lose our CCS funding? Because we lose our additional TRS funding but do we lose our CCS funding and so that is a concern for us here. Another issue that we have is, you know, some of the wording. The wording that we are changing to in the TRS guidelines is things like we've got to use "never," and so the wording is a lot stronger and a lot different, but also creating some gray area if you continue to read through some of those things.

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Another thing that we're having an issue with is that the additional 25 percent—this is not TRS related but the additional 25 percent that we were receiving for Covid during the Covid time ended in December, on December 31 of 2020 and so we are now not receiving that additional 25 percent on our funding anymore, and so that value has dropped and so we're trying to get that uplifted and upheld or even brought back. That 25 percent is something that we're looking at, as well.

Sorry. I'm trying to cover everything in a short time span. The biggest one was, like, the pre-star and then some of the citations that are on that pre-star registration form. That brings concern for us just because as a facility, I mean, that gives no room for the error

that may come from some of that and it's just not feasible for all schools. 1 2 As you look through majority of schools here in town, I know that we're trying to bring the level of education up and bring that push for that level 3 4 of quality of care up but this is giving us no room to breathe within some of 5 this because, I mean, paperwork error is a lot of those things. And paperwork error is a struggle as you can't always get it 100 percent, and so 6 7 you miss that 1 percent and you're now off TRS and you're losing that value and that money within your school. 8 9 I really that that's all I have for now. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. Thank you very much. 10 MR. TROBMAN: That brings us to the end of the 11 public comments today. 12 13 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much, Mr. Trobman. Commissioners, let's pause for a few moments before we tackle Agenda Item 8. 14 15 We'll take a quick break. 16 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Okay. We're ready to tackle the 17 rest of this. I'm not showing anything on Agenda Item 8. Let's move to 18 Agenda Item 9. Discussion, consideration, possible action regarding the 19 evaluation and effectiveness of the child care program report for fiscal 20 years 2019 and 2020 for submission to the 87^{th} Texas Legislature. 21 MS. MILLER: Good morning, Chairman, Commissioners, 22 Mr. Serna. For the record, I'm Reagan Miller with the Child Care and Early 23 Learning Division. Section 302.0042 of the Texas Labor Code requires TWC to 24 submit a report to the legislature no later than January 9--excuse me, January 15 of each odd-numbered year on the effectiveness of TWC's child care 25 program. The statue requires us to report on the wage and employment status

1 of parents receiving child care and proving the training of child care professionals and how we are collaborating with TEA, Head Start, DSDS and 2 HHCS. The statute was also amended last session directing TWC to provide 3 4 additional information and data on Texas Rising Star and how our payment 5 rates allow providers to provide high quality child care and also ensure that TWC meets our legislatively-established performance measure on the number of 6 7 children served per day. In the summary section of the report on page one, we noted that we have increased the number of Texas Rising Star quality 8 9 rating child care providers almost 64 percent since 2015 and subsidized child 10 care is a critical economic support which allows families to enter and remain 11 in the Texas workforce. We see that 86 percent of TANF parents found employment within 12 months of receiving child care and 86 percent of non-12 13 TANF parents maintained employment 12 months after receiving child care. 14 Today, we're seeking your direction on approval of 15 the Child Care Effectiveness Report for submission to the Texas legislature 16 and ask for the ability to make any needed technical corrections prior to 17 submission. I'm happy to answer any questions. 18 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: No comments here, Chairman. 19 20 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None here (unintelligible) 21 just appreciate you guys continuing to work in this space. It's been a very 22 important (unintelligible). 23 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Do we have a motion? 24 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that we 25 approve the report as presented by staff.

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    noon. Both the Texas House and Senate are expected to consider their rules
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    later this week and as these rules are adopted (unintelligible) how the
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    chambers will be operating this session. That concludes my remarks. I'm
