

## MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

## TUESDAY, March 9, 2021

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CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, all. This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public comment?

MR TROBMAN: Good morning, commissioners. No, we have no public comment this morning.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you, Mr. Trobman. Good morning, Ms. Miller.

MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. This brings us to the end of Agenda Items 3-7. Let's pause for a few moments to recess.

MS. MILLER: Thank you so much. Thank you commissioner.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, let's pick up with Agenda Item 8, Discussion, Consideration, and Possible Action Regarding the Acceptance of Pledges for Board Contract years 2020 and 2021 Child Care Matching Funds.

MR. WEAVER: Good morning, gentleman.

workforce Development boards submit local match pledges to

secure federal childcare funds pursuant to commission rule

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809.17. Commissioners, a couple of comments prior to our
requests. Today's agenda includes 18 match agreements from ten
boards, which includes Borderplex, Cameron County, Capital Area,
Concho Valley, Dallas, Heart of Texas, Lower Rio, Northeast,
Southeast and Texoma. All boards have secured a portion of
match with all boards securing at least 50% of their total.
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the 28, 26 boards have secured matched, of which 11 have
exceeded their local BCY 2021 match target. Boards have secured
102.67% of the statewide childcare local match target compared
to 108.92% at this time last year. One item of note, due to a
longstanding partner not participating this year for Cameron
County, the board was able to secure pledges from two new
partners, City of Harlingen and the County of Cameron. Due to
the new partners, Cameron County was able to secure their match
target for BCY 2021. We are very appreciative that the board
was not only able to secure new partners, but was also able to
expand their local partnership for childcare. Today, staff
requests commission acceptance of childcare pledges for
donations, transfers and certifications of expense for BCY 2021
in the amount of $6,645,028. Commissioners, this concludes my

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MR. HERR: Okay, good morning, everybody. 1 2 Good morning, chairman, commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, my name is Ethan Herr with Workforce Development. For 3 your consideration this morning is the Reemployment Services and 4 5 Eliqibility Assessment. That's the RESEA 2021 State Plan. States are statutorily required to submit this plan annually to 6 the U.S. Department of Labor. The plan is also an application 7 for funding. Texas's allocation this year is \$11,745,300, which is about 500,000 more than last year. This year's plan is 9 largely the same as last year's plan, as approved by DOL. The 10 numbers are different to reflect the change in this year's 11 allocation, but the methodology is the same. So this morning, 12 staff is seeking approval of the 2021 RESEA State Plan for 13 14 submission to DOL and I'm happy to answer any questions you may have. 15 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Ouestions or comments? 16 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, Chairman. 17 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: No questions here. 18 Thank you. 19 20 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Do you have a motion on this issue. 21 22 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I move that we approve the Unemployment Insurance Reemployment Service and 2.3 Eligibility Assessment State Grant Plan as discussed by staff. 24

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CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Chairman is seconding, votes unanimous. Thank you. According to Item 10, staff has nothing to report under Agenda Item 10. Agenda Item 11, Discussion, Consideration, and Possible Action Regarding a Discussion Paper on Child Care Excessive Absence Tracking.

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MS. WILSON: Good morning, chairman, commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, Allison Wilson, with the Child Care and Early Learning Division. Today for your consideration, we bring forward a discussion paper on temporary changes to requirements related to absence tracking for children participating in the subsidized child care program. For the past year, the commission has waved TWC's attendance standards as set forth in 40TAC 809.78 including the requirement to use TWC's automated attendance system. This waiver has provided relief to families during the COVID-19 emergency and has supported providers by allowing them to follow CDC guidance limiting access to their facilities to reduce viral spread. must procure a new automated attendance system. While we were in the procurement process and until procurement is complete, TWC will temporarily stop collecting all attendance data through an automated system. During this time, we will implement interim procedures to manually collect information from providers on excessive absences. Staff seeks direction on ending the waiver of 809.78 that was previously approved on March 17, 2020 and allowing boards to determine on a case-by-

case basis if a child's absence is Covid related and should be 1 excused. Staff also seeks direction on issuing guidance on 2 reinstating attendance requirements and interim procedures, 3 including instructing childcare programs to provide notice to 4 the board if a child accrues five consecutive absences. 5 Instructing boards to base 15 and 30-day absence notifications 6 7 required under 809.78(d)(1) on three and five provider notices respectively and instructing boards that the definition of excessive absences as set forth in 809.210 as 40 absences will 9 be based upon the receipt of eight provider notices. 10 concludes my remarks and I'm happy to answer to answer any 11 questions that you have. 12 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. MR. BRITT: Good morning, Mr. Chairman, commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, Michael Britt, Governmental Relations. This past Saturday, the U.S. Senate passed H.R.1319, the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Senate did make changes to the UI portions of this bill. changes made by the Senate would keep the Federal Unemployment Compensation Program or FPUC at \$300 per week, which is a reduction of \$100 per week from the U.S. House passed version of the bill. The Senate version of the bill does extend this benefit until September 6th of this year. The U.S. House is scheduled to take up the measure to concur with the Senate amendments to the bill this week and that vote could occur as soon as this afternoon. Regarding the Texas Legislature, the House Committee on International Relations and Economic Development has requested that TWC testify on House bill 7 by represent of button at their hearing on Wednesday. HB-7 would make changes to replenishment ratio used to determine an employer's unemployment compensation tax rate. Also, for the Texas Legislature, the deadline for filing bills for the 87th Texas Legislative Session is this Friday, March 12th. concludes my remarks and I'm happy to answer any questions that vou have.

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MR. SERNA: Chairman, we continue to work on making changes in response to the Governor's Executive Order with regard to the requirement of the mandate for the use of facemasks. In essence, what we will do for our employees, our contractors, and our customers is that will be something that will be strongly recommended in all of our offices, but not required in order to receive services or come to work. addition with the commission's approval, we will be looking at making some modifications to the Commission Hearing Room, our meeting room, to allow for hybrid meetings beginning as early as next Tuesday. Again, if you all agree, those changes will include making sure that there's adequate space in the audience, Plexiglas partitions between the commissioners. We will allow our staff to present either in-person or via Zoom, as they have been doing successfully. That will let us continue to provide the information and respond to the questions of the commissioners in real time.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. I think with the Governor's announcement last week for changes, I think they

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will start happening tomorrow and certainly for the commission
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   to meet in-person. I appreciate your work on that. I know that
   there's a lot of TWC employees that will be impacted and
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   certainly boards and board employees. Appreciate the
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   thoughtfulness that's going into that. As that gets developed,
   I'm sure we'll put that out in writing and I think folks will be
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   happy to see how that's clarified for them and have it in
   writing so they can see what exactly what they need to be doing.
