

## MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

1 THURSDAY, JUNE 24, 2021 2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, good morning, 3 everyone. The meeting is called to order. 4 COMPUTER: Recording in progress. 5 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Did Siri just interrupt 6 me? 7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yes. 8 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, everyone. 9 The meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed 10 up for public comment? 11 MR. TROBMAN: [inaudible] 12 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. Good morning, 13 Ms. Miller. 14 MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir. 15 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Let's take a quick break. 16 We'll get set up for the rest of this meeting. This changes 17 everything. I'm going to have get my other script out. All 18 right, let's start with Agenda Item A. This is FY 2022-24 final, Child Care and Development Fund State Plan. 19 20 ALLISON WILSON: [Unintelligible] 21 CHRIS NELSON: My mic was off, so I know it 22 wasn't me. Allison, are you there? Chairman, I suggest we move 23 to the next item and come back once we resolve the technical 24 difficulties.

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ALLISON WILSON: Can you hear me? Can you

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CHRIS NELSON: Yes, we can.

ALLISON WILSON: Okay. I apologize. I don't think I had the right link this morning, but I'm here now. So, good morning, Chairman, Commissioners and Mr. Townsend. For the record, Allison Wilson with the Childcare and Early Learning Division. Today for your consideration, we are bringing forward the final CCDF State Plan for federal fiscal years '22 through '24. The CCDF State Plan is the primary mechanism that the Administration for Children and Families uses to determine the state's compliance with the requirements of the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act. The plan is also a vehicle to publicly share state CCDF policies and quality improvement investments. During the development of the final plan, we sought and received input from the public and numerous stakeholders, including child care providers, advocacy organizations, workforce development boards and state partners. The final plan addresses much of this input, as well as changes that arose from the legislation passed during the recent 87th Legislative Session. Along with the final state plan, we also bring forward the Child Care Statewide Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Plan, which is a CCDF State Plan component. The disaster plan has been updated to incorporate lessons learned since the last publication in 2018. The Texas Department of Emergency

Management, HHSC's Child Care Regulation Division, the Texas

Early Learning Council and local boards provided input to inform

these revisions. We secured direction on submitting the final

state plan to the Administration for Children and Families

Office of Child Care on or before June 30<sup>th</sup>. We also request that

staff have authority to make technical changes, as needed, prior

to submission. And I'm happy to answer any questions you have.

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CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I have a comment regarding this particular agenda item. Before we take any action on this item, I wanted to discuss a recent exchange I had with the Houston delegation and specifically with Dr. Quianta Moore, a Huffington Fellow in Child Health Policy with Rice University. She explained the profound impact the language has on our child care program and what it has, along with its parents. The word subsidies can have a negative connotation. If we change that term to scholarships, we will find that we will not only change expectations for the child, but also find that the parent becomes invested in the program. For example, my child received a scholarship, rather than my child receives subsidies -- subsidized care. By phrasing the financial assistance we provide as child care scholarships, we would help reinforce the idea that the parents are receiving something of value, something to be proud of, and it helps the parents to be invested in the child care they are receiving. It also

1 highlights the value of the education we are providing to our 2 children. As our program continues to reinforce the importance 3 of quality child care, we have an opportunity to drive home the 4 point that we are investing in these parents and their children. 5 I would ask staff to look at changing the language around the 6 child care program to move away from subsidized to child care 7 scholarships in our interactions with parents and our managing--8 our messaging with providers, parents, partners, children and 9 the public. I look forward to having staff bring these--their 10 ideas on how to implement this change. 11 ALLISON WILSON: Thank you, Commissioner 12 Alvarez. We are certainly happy to look into that for you. 13 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: No other comments 14 here. I think that's a good idea to have staff look into that. I 15 had the pleasure of hearing her presentation, as well, and I 16 think there's something to it, so it'd be good to have staff go 17 out, look into it, look at the advantages of marketing the 18 program that way and seeing if there's any inherent benefits 19 for--of it. 20 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Are you asking for that to 21 be changed in this report or just to bring it forward for action 22 at a later date? 23 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Bring it back. Bring

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it back later on.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Later--at a later date?

1 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: That's correct, sir. 2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. All right. So, 3 any other comments on today's--4 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: No comments. 5 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: So, staff will bring back 6 at a later date some recommendations for a policy decision with 7 regard to what we call the subsidy, and today I think we need to 8 take action on this report and move it along. 9 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Okay. Chairman, are 10 you ready for the motion? I move that we approve the CCDF and 11 State Plan, and the Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Response 12 Plan and allow staff to make any technical corrections, as 13 needed. 14 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Second. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 15 16 seconded, and we're unanimous. Is that it on eight? Yes? 17 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I believe 18 that's it for tonight. 19 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. I don't think 20 we have anything on nine. Do we have anything on ten? 21 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: We do not have 22 anything on ten. 23 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: We do not have anything on 24 ten. Board nominations, Agenda Item 11.

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                         SHUNTA WILLIAMS: Good morning, Chairman,
   Commissioners and Mr. Nelson. For the record, Shunta Williams
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   with the Workforce Development Division. And before you today
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   for consideration, we have Workforce Board nominations from
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   three areas. Staff recommends approval for Workforce Solutions
   Gulf Coast, Middle Rio Grande, and Texoma. That concludes my
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   request, and I'm here to answer any questions you have.
