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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Okay. Let's reconvene.
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                         COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Mr. Chairman, as we
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   reconvene, I wanted to go back to the last item, in approving
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    the short-form--or the list from the UI short-form dissent list,
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   and I wanna restate the motion. I actually accepted those under
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   wages, but I want to accept it under the UI claim [inaudible]
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   make that motion. So, I wanna concur with the chairman's motion,
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except for the cases on which I am dissenting, as reflected in the UI short-form dissent for docket 29, versus the wages short-form dissent list.

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CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, thank you.

COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Let's move to Agenda Item 8, JET advisory board recommendations.

MR. SNIADECKI: Good morning, Chairman, Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson, and Director Serna. Matt Sniadecki, with the Office of Employer Initiatives. Today I'm here to present the FY '21 JET advisory board recommendation before the commission for action. The FY '21 Jobs and Education for Texans request for applications was issued on March 26, 2021. The JET funding allocation for this RFA was comprised of \$8 million in general revenue funds, \$2 million in Perkins funds, and \$900,000 in IKEA funds, designated for consumables, totaling \$10.9 million. Fifty-six applications were received, 23 applications from institutions of higher education, and 33 applications from independent school districts. House bill 3062 from the 84 legislative session states the advisory board shall meet at least once each quarter or as needed to review received applications and recommend awarding grants under this chapter. On July 8, 2021, the JET advisory board met to review fiscal year 2021 JET applications. The advisory board made the following recommendation to the commission. To recommend the

1 commission to direct staff to move forward with awarding grants based on the final evaluation score, with the ability to move 3 down the list 50 points and above, as recaptured funds become 4 available during the contracting phase, and to utilize remaining 5 ISD funds to fund additional IHE grants. Staff seeks direction 6 on commission approval of the advisory board's recommendation as 7 outlined above regarding awarding FY '21 JET RFA applications. 8 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions? COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, Chairman. COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Do we have a motion? 12 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that 13 we direct staff to move forward with awarding grants based on 14 the final evaluation score, with ability to move down the list 15 50 points and above, as recaptured funds become available during 16 the contracting phase, and to utilize remaining ISD funds to 17 fund additional IHE grants. 18 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Second. 19 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 20 seconded. We're unanimous. Thank you. 21 MR. SNIADECKI: Thank you. 22 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: We don't have anything

actions from the U.S. House Appropriations Committee as it relates to the fiscal year 2022 Labor, Health, and Human Services and Education title. We do expect that that action will be combined into a minibus appropriations bill soon, and when we get the legislative text for the bill number we will update your offices with that information. Also, there's four hearings that we're monitoring at the congressional level. Today at 10:15, the U.S. House, Education, and Labor Subcommittee on Health, Employment, Labor, and Pension, Subcommittee on Higher Education and Workforce Investment will hold a hearing on investigating in the direct care workforce. On Wednesday at 10:15, the U.S. House, Education, and Labor Subcommittee on Health, Employment, Labor, ad Pensions will hold a hearing titled Phasing Out Sub-Minimum Wage. On Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. the U.S. House Judiciary Committee will hold a hearing on H.R. 1936, which is the Childcare Choices Act of 2021. And then on Thursday at 10:00 a.m. the U.S. Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions Committee will hold a hearing titled The Right to Organize: Empowering American Workers in a 21st Century Economy. We'll provide summaries to your offices for the committee actions. That concludes my remarks. I'm happy to answer any questions you may have.
