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4 Background

- 5 On August 17, 2021, the Texas Workforce Commission's (TWC) three-member Commission
- 6 (Commission) approved \$1.2 million for an Adult Education and Literacy (AEL) Employer
- 7 Engagement Initiative.
- 8 The AEL Employer Engagement initiative seeks grant recipients that will partner with employers
- 9 to develop curricula for workplace programs and to deliver AEL services to eligible employees
- 10 for workplace literacy activities and at least one of the following:
- Workplace literacy with employer-provided training
- Integrated Education and Training
- 13 The AEL Employer Engagement initiative is part of TWC's comprehensive statewide strategy to
- end the middle skills gap in Texas. Due to technological advances in the workplace, employment
- demand has dramatically increased the need for middle-skilled workers, defined as workers with
- some education beyond high school but less than a four-year degree. This initiative aims to help
- put more Texas workers on a path to careers in rewarding middle skills jobs through
- 18 collaboration with AEL grant recipients, AEL service providers, and Texas employers.
- 19 Texas Labor Code states in section 315.007(d) "...the members of the commission [must]
- approve the award of any funds under this chapter."

21 Issue

- 22 The anticipated grant start date is July 2022, and three grant recipients have been recommended
- for awards totaling \$1,190,243. This amount is lower than the original budget of \$1,200,000 for
- the project, as proposed on August 17, 2021.
- 25 The following awards, totaling \$1,190,243, require the approval of the Commission:
- One grant award, totaling \$400,000

- 30 Staff recommends that the Commission approve the three awards totaling \$1,190,243, as
- 31 outlined above.
