	SB 337 amended Texas Labor Code, Chapter 302, Subchapter A by adding §302.003. Grants to Facilitate Participation in Apprenticeship Training Programs by Certain Veterans and Military Personnel.
	Texas Labor Code, §302.00341(a) defines "apprenticeship training program" and "nonprofit organization."
	Texas Labor Code, §302.00341(b) requires TWC to "develop and administer a prograunder which the commission may award grants to one or more nonprofit organization duty military service members who are transitioning into civilian employment."
	Texas Labor Code, §302.00341(c) stipulates that a grant awarded under Texas Labor Code, §302.00341 may be used only to recruit or assist veterans or transitioning servi members.
	Texas Labor Code, §302.00341(d) requires TWC to adopt rules to administer this gra These rules must include a process to verify that state funds awarded to a nonprofit organization under Texas Labor Code, §302.00341 are used appropriately.
