CHAIRMAN DANIEL: The motion passes with the exceptions noted. That brings us to the end of Agenda Items 3 through 7. We'll take a short break.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: OK, we're back. Agenda

Item 8 has been postponed to a future meeting. This is Agenda

Item 9, WIOA statewide funds for WIOA customers and

cybersecurity.

BENJAMIN HOLQUIST: [inaudible]

BENJAMIN HOLQUIST: Commissioners, before you today for your consideration for approval is a discussion paper regarding a one-time distribution of 2.7 million WIOA statewide dollars to the boards to pay for cybersecurity improvements or if the board does not have a current cybersecurity need, to support additional direct services as Texans continue to return to work. The 2.7 million would be distributed to boards as indicated in the discussion paper with the distribution proportional to the board's size after a baseline amount of the funding is assigned to every board. Boards will determine whether they can use the money best on cybersecurity strengthening or direct services. Staff recommends distributing 2.7 million of WIOA statewide funding to the boards as shown in the discussion paper to support cybersecurity

1 acceleration or client service delivery. This concludes my 2 presentation. I'm happy to answer any questions you may have. 3 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions? COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, chairman. 4 5 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Tell me more about the 6 7 cybersecurity. What-any kind of cybersecurity improvements? 8 BENJAMIN HOLQUIST: This is to fund any kind 9 of cybersecurity improvements, physical, hardware that is 10 needed, cybersecurity consulting, other things like that that 11 are needed to improve the maturity scores. 12 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Have we done a recent 13 assessment with boards on their cybersecurity needs? 14 BENJAMIN HOLQUIST: We've been doing work 15 with cybersecurity. I don't know if we've done a recent 16 assessment. There is a maturity score. 17 BENJAMIN HOLQUIST: Mr. Chairman, we have 18 done an assessment that we funded of all the boards. We have a 19 ranking. Of course, that report is protected under state statute 20 because of the nature of the report but based on that, then we 21 are allocating-we came up with the idea to allocate funds to 22 those boards that had significant-not significant deficiency but

deficiencies to address those to protect our data.

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   idea of like a prioritization of cybersecurity needs that these
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   funds could definitely help address.

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   RESEA State Plan 2022.
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                         DAWN CRONIN: Good morning, Chairman Daniel,
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   Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson, Mr. Serna. For the
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record, my name is Dawn Cronin, and I have for your consideration this morning the Reemployment Services and Eligibility Assessment State Plan update or the RESEA State Plan for program year 2022. This plan provides our annual update for the RESEA program as required by DOL, and has been required since 2020. The plan also serves as Texas's application for the RESEA formula funds for the program year 2022 allotment. For Texas it will be \$16,860,815. This is roughly a 5-million dollar increase over program year 2021. Texas program year 2022 State Plan is due to the DOL or Department of Labor on or before March 7, 2022. DOL guidance for this year's plan update encourages states to continue to grow their RESEA programs and encourages the state to continue increasing outreach for UI claimants, to establish reemployment services as well as increasing the number of permanent state staff, and the additional funding will be used to do those two things. I'd like to highlight the changes for this year's plan over last year's plan, the updated funding request. Last year's amount was a little over-it was like 11.7 million, a little under 12. Updates to the staffing time and cost for conducting an RESEA appointment at the Workforce Solutions office, this is a composite rate. Updated estimates for the total number of RESEA appointments to be scheduled, the total number of appointments to be completed which includes the required RESEA services, and the number of claimants that will fail to report which is roughly a little less than 25 percent.

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Updates on the actions that the state has taken to reduce the claimant failure rate which includes things like allowing the claimants to self-schedule appointments, automated reminders, and then structuring of notifications and other communications for readability. The updated information, the statutorily required evaluations for the RESEA program as well as statements to address equitable outreach and service to underserved populations and communities such as those in rural communities, and underserved groups. Staff recommends the approval of the RESEA program year 2022 State Plan update and submission to the Department of Labor by or before March 7th. That concludes my presentation and I'm happy to answer any questions you might have.
