

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

DATE

JUNE 7, 2022

Tuesday, June 7, 2022

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning. This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public comment?

MR. TROBMAN: No, sir.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you so much. Good afternoon, Ms. Gonzales.

MS. GONZALES: Morning.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, what else do we have left on this agenda? Mr. Serna, is there an executive director's report?

MR. SERNA: Sorry for the what we'll call out of cycle executive director's report but there are several things I want to make sure that we all were aware of before time got away from us. First off, I wanted to make sure that the commission knew that I'd be providing written responses or written comments to Department of Labor rule regarding employment services staff and staffing. We'll make sure that your offices each get a copy of the written responses that I provide when we submit those responses so that's going to be forthcoming. These are rules that DOL had originally taken up prior to the pandemic and then they were suspended, and now they're taking them back up again. We've sought input from stakeholders so we'll be including that. Second, Commissioner Alvarez, you had a request to us last week to use unused TANF

funds for two education outreach specialists in Middle Rio. I'm 2 pleased to report the conversations that we've had with the 3 board executive director, Betty Sifuentes. Ms. Sifuentes has 4 indicated that they have unexpended TANF funds and will be 5 bringing on board two education outreach specialists so we won't 6 have to take any action at state level to support them in that 7 effort. We will of course support them through Lori Knight's 8 team's efforts to give the two new hires information and other 9 things that they need and will continue to support that board but we don't have to expend any unused statewide TANF dollars 10 11 for that so I believe that's been taken care of per the 12 commission's request. 13 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Ed, would those 14 positions be under Lori or report directly to the board? 15 MR. SERNA: They'll report directly to the 16 board. They will be under Ms. Sifuentes. 17 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: OK, got it. 18 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Ed, can I ask another 19 thing when you-20 MR. SERNA: Yes, sir. 21 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Two things that I 22 think I reference, and first of all I want to thank you for 23 working so closely with Ms. Sifuentes on this initiative, and I 24 appreciate the fact that they're going to be using their reserve 25 TANF dollars. A couple of things that I did highlight last week.

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One was preferably if we could hire individuals from the community as outreach specialists, those that can speak both English and Spanish would be preferred, right? And those that are familiar with the demographics and just the people in general. And then the other one was what I thought was the most important was that these individuals that work as outreach specialists are familiar and really kind of focus on dropout recovery. I mean dropout recovery is going to be key to the success of this program. As we know, that was certainly an issue and even though there's a low percentage of people that have dropped out of high school or school in that area just by the research we've done, it's still something that needs to be addressed so I appreciate you.

MR. SERNA: We'll make sure that we can convey that to Ms. Sifuentes but I think that that's probably already something that she wants to do, especially hiring local in community and of course with the skills to be bilingual.

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Thank you for all you've done, Ed. She was very complimentary on the work you've done there.

MR. SERNA: I appreciate that. The third thing is the request that the chairman had given me some time ago to look at having commission meetings out of Austin. Staff considered some alternatives and considering that this upcoming year is a legislative year, we're going to recommend two out-of-

town commission meetings. The first will be, if the commission agrees to this, the first will be at our annual conference in early December in Dallas, and the second will be after the legislative session and we'll work with the offices to determine a location for that but it will probably be in some rural part of the state because I think the request from the commission was to have a mix of urban and rural so we'll look for the second one to be in a rural location but the first will be at our annual conference. We've already got facilities and everything set up so we'll get that on the calendar and get that posted as well if that's acceptable to the commission.

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: So am I correct that the one that we had scheduled that we had discussed in September while we had the apprenticeship summit, that one has been rescheduled?

MR. SERNA: Yes, sir.

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: OK.

 $$\operatorname{MR.}$ SERNA: We won't have that one. We're just going to have the two.

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: OK.

MR. SERNA: And then the last thing that I wanted to share was at last week's Texas Digital Government Summit hosted by Government Technology magazine, TWC won two Best in Texas awards. The first was for best workforce or workplace innovation using technology and innovation to advance

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   equal employment and fair housing. Our civil rights division
   received an award for their significant move working with IT for
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   their significant move to a paperless information flow so we're
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   very proud of Brian and his work, and then second, we received
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   the excellence in project management. Thomas Beckley in our IT
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   shop was recognized for his innovative use in implementing a
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   combination of web-based version of Microsoft Project and Power
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   Builder to build project dashboards so we're very pleased that
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   we won two of the Best in Texas awards, one for an individual
   and one for a division's efforts, and I just wanted to report
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   that to the commission as well. Other than that, I'll answer any
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   questions that the commission may have but I just wanted to make
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   sure that you knew about those especially the ES comments and
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   the follow up on education outreach specialists.

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date that's been considered?

1 MR. SERNA: It will be either-it will 2 probably be the Tuesday of the annual conference because our 3 conference starts on Wednesday but there are events that go on 4 on Monday and Tuesday including TAWB and EDC and some of our VR 5 so it will probably be on a Tuesday and we're thinking Tuesday afternoon to give the commissioners and staff time to get there 6 7 for the commission meeting. 8 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: OK. The sooner we 9 have those dates and times, it will allow us to work on our 10 schedules [inaudible]. 11 MR. SERNA: Yes, sir. We'll have the 12 specific date and time here probably before the week is up. 13 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: OK. 14 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I agree because I 15 know during that time, we meet with various people there and so 16 I'm sure room assignments will be designated where we're going 17 to have all this, will be on site or off site? What are you 18 thinking, Ed? 19 MR. SERNA: No, it will be where the 20 conference is so we'll already be at the facility. 21 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Perfect, love it. 22 That's all regarding that, chairman. 23 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. Thank you, Mr. 24 Serna.

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COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: The only other thing I'd like to add, chairman, if it's OK, is I was sadly informed last week that Clay was going to retire so I wanted to acknowledge that. I think we're all going to miss you, Clay. My six years that I've been here, it's been a privilege to work with you. I really mean it. I really appreciate your leadership and especially during the pandemic so I was saddened to read the text or the email last week but I certainly wish you well. And if I may, chairman, I'd like to introduce two people at this time that just joined our office. One of them is Jade Ybarra who is here from Austin. She comes to us from TDCJ so we're glad to have Ms. Ybarra here working with us, Jade. And then of course we have our new intern that I wanted to recognize. She's from Edinburg, Texas, undergraduate from the Rio Grande Valley, going to law school at Texas Tech. We're excited for that and she was a legislative director for a state representative, Bobby Guerra, so welcome aboard to both of you.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: The world needs more Red Raiders I have discovered. It's good to have one from Edinburg. I went to school with a guy from Roma undergrad. He used to make that drive all the time. It's a little ways from the Valley but I think you'll find Texas Tech to be quite good. Tell me again, what's your classification there?

We have Josh Hall, University of Houston student, and we also have Alejandro Perez, a UTSA student as well. Two sharp individuals that are going to do some great work on our team. Delighted to have them here, and this Friday we're going to be kicking off our first event that's a virtual summit in collaboration with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. It's going to be a virtual summit at 10 o'clock so go to Texas Interns Unite! to register for that event, and we'll take it from there and do something in July and September but that's more details to come as well but Texas Interns Unite! that's where we want to go for these activities, and again, thank you guys for the support.

I'm not sure it that's an 12 intern or-13 [inaudible] 14 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Not bad at all. 15 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Congratulations to 16 all of you. So exciting to see all new faces here. You guys are 17 the future of this great state of ours, and someday all three of 18 us I hope will-we all know that one of you-we'd love to see all 19 three of you somebody taking our places. That's really our goal 20 is to have you all the next commissioners of this Texas 21 workforce, this great agency that we all represent so welcome 22 aboard. 23 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: I'd swap places with one 24 of them right now. I'd love to be an intern again. That would be 25 awesome.
