

MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

1 Tuesday, June 28, 2022 2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning. This meeting 3 is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public 4 comment? 5 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much. Good 6 morning, Ms. Miller. 7 MS. MILLER: Good morning, sir. 8 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much. We'll 9 take a short break. 10 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 8, 11 Chapter 808, Youth Driver Education Funding Program. 12 BEN HOLQUIST: [inaudible] 13 BEN HOLQUIST: In an open meeting on 14 February 8, 2022, the commission approved proposed rule to add 15 Chapter 808 regarding funding youth driver education and testing 16 for youth driver education and testing for eligible populations. 17 The proposed rule amendments were published on February 25, 18 2022, issue of the Texas Register for a 30-day public comment 19 period. Public comments were received. Staff reviewed and 20 responded to those comments and as a result of those comments 21 modified the proposed rules. Changes were made to clarify that 22 applications will be accepted in more than one way, that staff 23 will contact applicants whose eligibility cannot be determined 24 based on provided documents, and that if a driver education 25 provider requires payment prior to registration, applicants

should not register prior to applying for the program, and remove language to clarify what would trigger the three-month waiting period. Staff recommends adopting the final rule for Chapter 808. Should the commission adopt these rules, staff requests the ability to make minor nonsubstantive changes to the document in order to comply with publication requirements for the Texas Register and the Office of the Secretary of State. This concludes my presentation. I'm happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I have one quick

comment. I have one question. Can you answer me how we're going

to market this?

BEN HOLQUIST: We are going to be making a push later this summer, August or September, to publicize this to the various media outlets. There will also be a press release. We are also reaching out to our partner organizations and our transition centers in Workforce Solutions offices. We are developing a one-pager desk aid for staff that may encounter youths that are eligible for this program to guide them through quickly how to apply for this program.

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: So you're working closely with Angela, our communications team and all of them? You're going to work with them.

BEN HOLQUIST: Correct.

1 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: No other questions, 2 chairman. 3 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I was going to add, 4 you guys may want to add the trucking association, John 5 Esparza's team over there. They have some interest in these 6 efforts and so quite often if the student obtains a driver's 7 license, then they may look at the opportunities that are out there in the CDL world as well but the driver's license is the 8 9 beginning, the start. 10 BEN HOLQUIST: We'll definitely work with 11 him. 12 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 13 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that 14 we adopt the new Chapter 808 regarding the Youth Driver 15 Education Funding Program with the changes recommended by staff. 16 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Second. 17 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 18 seconded, we're unanimous. Thank you. This is Agenda Item 9, 19 Chapter 840, WIOA eligible training providers. 20 JOEL MULLINS: Good morning, Chairman 21 Daniel, Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson, Mr. Serna. 22 For the record, I'm Joel Mullins with Workforce Development. 23 This morning for your consideration are the final rules for 24 Chapter 840 which will clarify requirements for participants, 25 local Workforce Development Boards, and eligible training

providers. The proposed rules were published in the March 25, 2022, issue of the Texas Register for a 30-day public comment period. One comment was received although staff did not make any changes to the rule based on this comment. This morning staff seeks direction on the adoption of the Chapter 840 final rules as provided in your meeting materials. I'm happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, chairman.

COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None.

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that we adopt the amendments to 40 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 840, WIOA eligible training providers as recommended by staff.

COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I second.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and seconded. We're unanimous. Thank you. This is Agenda Item 10, Chapter 849, employment and training services for dislocated workers.

JOEL MULLINS: Once again for the record,

consideration are the final rules for Chapter 849 which will

align the rules with the DOL's TAA final rule and will serve as

the four-year rule review as required by the Texas Government

Code. The proposed rules were published in the May 6, 2022,

1 issue of the Texas Register for a 30-day public comment period. 2 No comments were received. This morning staff seeks direction on 3 the adoption of the Chapter 849 final rules as provided in your 4 meeting materials, and I'm happy to answer any questions. 5 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions? 6 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, chairman. COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None. 7 8 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 9 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I move that we adopt 10 the amendments to 40 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 849 as 11 recommended by staff. 12 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I second. 13 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 14 seconded. We're unanimous. 15 JOEL MULLINS: Thank you. 16 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 11, 17 approval of the 2022 nondiscrimination plan. 18 JOHN GREYTOK: Good morning. For the record, 19 I am John Greytok, a statewide equal opportunity officer. This 20 plan is to provide equal access to participants and to protect 21 the civil rights of those who are involved in the workforce 22 system throughout the state. I want to recognize the work of Ms. Connie Zubeldia. She's our statewide EO coordinator and spent 23 24 quite a bit of time on this plan. The plan has been reviewed by 25 the governor. The next step is for the commission to consider

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   it, and then it will be sent to the Department of Labor.
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   Therefore, the staff asks that the commission adopt the 2022
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   nondiscrimination plan subject to minor nonsubstantive edits.

For the record, Cherie Dudley with 6 the Workforce Development Division. This morning for your 7 consideration we have workforce board nominations for Capital 8 Area, Golden Crescent, and Gulf Coast. Staff recommends approval 9 on the presented nominees, and I'm here to answer any questions 10 you may have. 11 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Comments or questions? 12 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, chairman. 13 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None. 14 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 15 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that 16 we approve the board nominees for Capital Area, Golden Crescent, 17 and Gulf Coast. 18 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I second. 19 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 20 seconded. We're unanimous. 21 CHERIE DUDLEY: Thank you. 22 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. I'm showing 23 nothing on the agenda for Agenda Items 13, 14, 15, 16. Is there 24 a legislative report? How about an executive director's report?

Not today? Is there any other order of business to come before the commission?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Yes, chairman. I would like to ask Ed for something. In February 2020, Governor Abbott provided revised charges to the tri-agency members, readiness, completion, transitions, upskilling, educator pipeline, partnerships, infrastructure. Ed, I would like staff to host a work session to facilitate discussions between the commissioners, TWC program staff, and representation from the boards to do the following: Provide an update on TWC and board progress on tri-agency charges; discuss priorities of the commissioners and TWC on how they connect to those tri-agency charges; discuss the implementation of commission and TWC priorities at the board level; facilitating communications, feedback, and best practices sharing between the agency and the boards as well as members of the boards; create a plan to improve communication and interaction between the tri-agency and the commissioners so our agency can effectively contribute to the meeting of the governor's charges; five, develop innovative strategies to proactively address the needs of employers and employees in Texas and strengthen the agency's relevance in workforce development, and encourage workforce development boards to work across areas to support a stronger Texas economy.

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1 MR. SERNA: Yes, sir. We'll put a plan 2 together and present it to each office as soon as we get it on 3 the scheduled agenda, not agenda but a scheduled time. 4 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Thank you. 5 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Commissioner 6 Alvarez, you're asking for a work session? 7 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I am. 8 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: A work session, OK. 9 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Anything else? 10 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I wanted to 11 basically thank the Workforce Solutions offices, the CEOs and 12 EDs, for attending the Texas Economic Development Council's 13 midyear conference, and then to congratulate those Workforce 14 Solutions offices that won awards. There were Workforce 15 Excellence awards presented. I think Workforce Solutions 16 Borderplex actually, a team out of El Paso actually won an 17 award. Ed, thank you for attending. Ed was actually out on 18 vacation but came over to attend that conference. Staff did a 19 phenomenal job, and Courtney, I see her in the audience, you 20 moderated a panel. I called her courageous Courtney and took 21 care of business but I really appreciate the work that the staff 22 did there. This is the first-well, they normally have workforce 23 efforts with TEDC and really had a tremendous turnout of the 24 workforce team there at the conference so, Commissioner Alvarez,

thanks for joining us there at that conference as well. I saw
