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CHAIRMAN DANIEL: The motion passes with the exceptions noted. We're going to take a short break.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. This is Agenda

Item 8, Acceptance of a Donation from the Bill and Melinda Gates

Foundation.

REAGAN MILLER: Good morning, chairman, commissioners. For the record, Reagan Miller with the Child Care and Early Learning Division. This morning for your consideration we have a \$160,000 donation from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to support an analysis of the Texas early childhood data landscape. As we previously briefed your offices the interagency early childhood agencies have been working together to examine the possible creation of an early childhood integrated data system or ECIDS. These types of systems coordinate early childhood data and is collected across multiple state agencies who are all serving young children but who have independent data systems, and ECIDS makes it possible to integrate and report information from early childhood programs across multiple agencies. The donation from Gates Foundation will assist with an analysis of the early childhood data landscape in Texas with this work being carried out by third sector intelligence or 3SI, again, in support of the interagency exploration of an ECIDS. The notebook item contains the grant agreement between the Gates Foundation and 3SI. We want to note

1 that only the 160,000 within this larger grant agreement is 2 being donated. That concludes my remarks. 3 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments of questions? COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, chairman. 4 5 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Do we have a motion? 6 7 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that 8 we approve, acknowledge, and accept a gift or donation of 9 160,000 in value given from the Bill and Melinda Gates 10 Foundation to the Texas Workforce Commission to analyze the 11 early childhood data landscape in Texas as discussed by staff. 12 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Second. 13 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 14 seconded, motion carries. 15 REAGAN MILLER: Thank you. 16 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. This is Agenda 17 Item 9, Rider 36, Business Enterprises of Texas Customer 18 Satisfaction Survey and Cost Analysis Report. 19 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Good morning, Mr. 20 Chairman, Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson, and Mr. 21 Serna. For the record, Jennifer Colehower, interim director of 22 Business Enterprises of Texas, Vocational Rehabilitation 23 Division. Commissioners, before you today for your consideration 24 for approval is the BET Customer Satisfaction Survey and Cost 25 Analysis Report to the Governor and LBB pursuant to TWC Rider 36

as part of TWC performance reporting for the 22-23 biennium. The survey covers state host agencies' satisfaction of operational conditions such as pricing requirements, hours of operation, menu items, and product lines for cafeterias, snack bars, and convenience stores located in state agency buildings. This year's survey was conducted from June 6, to June 30, 2022, and received 615 responses. Of note, more than 89 percent of all respondents use the services that BET managers offer in the workplace, about 60 percent of respondents agree that healthy food options and prices are good, and 80 percent of respondents agreed the quality of food was three stars or better, 87 percent agreed the quality of service three stars or better, and 88 percent of respondents feel comfortable eating in BET facilities. Staff is seeking commission's approval of this year's annual report for submission to the governor and the LBB, and permission to make nonsubstantive corrections to the final formatting of the report. That concludes my presentation. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Thanks, Jennifer. COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Thank you. Lot of positive responses. The percentages were very high. JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Yes, [inaudible]. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: According to my records, I don't have a record of you having presented before the

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commission. Is that correct?

1 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: It's been years. 2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: But not during my tenure. 3 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Like decades. I think 4 my daughter who's a sophomore in college was three at the time. 5 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Three years old? I'd say 6 then no, you haven't really presented in front of the 7 commission. On page 36, line seven in the report, if you-I'm 8 kidding. Do we have a motion? 9 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that 10 we approve Business Enterprises of Texas Customer Satisfaction 11 Survey and Cost Analysis Report 2022, for submission to the 12 governor and the Legislative Budget Board as recommended by 13 staff. 14 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Second. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 15 16 seconded. Motion carries. 17 JENNIFER COLEHOWER: Thank you. 18 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 13, 19 Board Nominations. 20 CHERIE DUDLEY: Good morning, chairman, 21 commissioners, and Mr. Serna. For the record, Cherie Dudley with 22 the Workforce Development Division. Today for your consideration 23 we have Workforce Board nominations for South Texas, Middle Rio 24 Grande, Panhandle, and Permian Basin. Staff recommends approval

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1 on the presented nominees, and I'm here to answer any questions 2 you may have. 3 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? 4 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, chairman. 5 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 6 7 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: I move to approve the 8 board nominees for South Texas, Middle Rio Grande, Panhandle, 9 and Permian Basin. 10 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I second. 11 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 12 seconded. The motion carries. 13 CHERIE DUDLEY: Thank you. 14 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. We have a 15 legislative person moving back here like there's a legislative 16 report. Mr. Serna was giving me the, no, we don't have a 17 legislative report signal but you clearly disagree, Christopher, 18 so why don't you come up here and talk to us about what's on 19 your mind. 20 CHRISTOPHER GRUNING: I was waiting for my 21 number and name to be called. Good morning, Chairman Daniel, 22 Commissioner Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson, and Mr. Serna. For 23 the record, I'm Christopher Gruning with Government Relations. 24 GR is monitoring one federal hearing this week. Tomorrow the 25 U.S. House Education and Labor Subcommittee on Health,

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   Employment, Labor, and Pensions will be holding a hearing to
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   examine the administration of the unemployment insurance system.
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   Additionally, current federal government funding expires next
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   Friday, September 30th. Congressional leaders are in negotiations
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   regarding a continuing resolution to extend funding, and that is
   expected to be considered before the end of the month. We will
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   update your offices as soon as an agreement has been reached.
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   Regarding the state legislature, TWC's joint budget hearing has
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   been scheduled for Wednesday, September 28, 2022, at one p.m.
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   Mr. Serna and Chris Nelson will be testifying at this hearing on
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   behalf of TWC. This concludes my remarks and I'm happy to answer
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   any questions you may have.

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   just wanted to-if you haven't had a chance to see this morning's
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   Rio Grande Guardian, it's a blog in the Rio Grande Valley,
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governor sent out a press release acknowledging the value of apprenticeship and some of the strides that have been made. Again, I would like to thank Desi and her team for that. He acknowledged Norma who is going through a superintendent's program, a single mother who went through the program and successfully completed it through the assistance of South Texas College which, by the way, we will be hosting-the agency will be hosting the sixth annual apprenticeship conference. I will tell you that this conference continues to get better and better, and I'm very excited of the speakers that have been asked to present at this year's conference, and I'm grateful to the governor and his team for acknowledging the great work that not only the Texas Workforce Commission is doing but all the colleges and employers to expand apprenticeship programs. Just this week we had an opportunity-I should say last week as well, we met with Boeing to look at their workforce needs and how we could implement apprenticeship programs there, and yesterday we were at Southwest Institute with the help of Kristie Caviness, and Sonya and Desi were all there so we also would like to acknowledge Adrian Lopez for the great work he's doing in expanding his program. We're in space now. We've been in space and now to be working with the Southwest Research Institute, that's a great thing. We had an opportunity to visit with what they're doing with NASA and again, Boeing, some of the planes and fighter planes that they're working on. It was a big treat,

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and to know that students that we're going to be assisting are going to go through these programs, it's certainly gratifying, and makes me feel really good that the agency has been able to support these types of programs. So I look forward to seeing many of you at the apprenticeship summit, and again I want to take this opportunity to thank Kerry Ballast, Desi Holmes, and of course everyone who's been involved in expanding apprenticeship programs. Who knows? Pretty soon we're going to have that apprenticeship nurse that's going to be approved.

We've got great momentum going forward and so we're just waiting for Department of Labor to see what we can do to approve those standards. Hopefully we'll get something approved soon. That's all I got.

Alvarez, good work in regard to the apprenticeship conference that's taking place on the 22nd and 23rd. When I mentioned the agency was putting it on, we were looking at an internship conference and we decided to do that on the 21st, the day before, and so we're going to be in the Valley at what I have termed the Rally in the Valley so on the 21st we'll be doing our Texas Interns Unite! Rally in the Valley program in Brownsville, both Workforce Solutions of Cameron County and also the Workforce Solutions office, Pat Hobbs, and Francisco Almaraz. Frank and his team are helping out in that regard so we're looking forward to an exciting event. We have a dynamic lineup and appreciate

the support of the agency and the team in that regard. Lastly, I also had an opportunity to attend the Artie Lee Hinds Award ceremony. I met Ed there as well, and then Calvin and Juan and Marie were all there as well. Just a phenomenal program, and I quess you guys have participated in those programs and you see the benefit of a nonprofit organization of CRPs really standing up opportunities for folks to go to work. It means a lot to those individuals, and I was touched by what was happening with those individuals. We had the keynote speaker was Josh from our conference last year, and so he was actually attending there. Judy Maggio, the emcee, said she had never been to an event where she both laughed and cried so much as a result of what was happening there but, Ed, very well-the agency was very well received, and they respect you a lot just talking a bit with the folks there, and so I continue to appreciate the work that's being done in that area as well.
