

## MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, everyone.

This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up for public comment?

MR. TROBMAN: Good morning, commissioners, Les Trobman, general counsel. We have one individual who would like to address the commission this morning. Mr. Muhammad, if you could go ahead and unmute yourself, state your name for the record, and go ahead.

MR. MUHAMMAD: OK, can you hear me?

MR. TROBMAN: Yes, sir.

MR. MUHAMMAD: Good morning, commissioners, chairman, I'm Risheem Muhammad. I'm the founder of EDS here in Houston. It's a veteran organization that was established in 2016. I'm here today to just request consideration for a rule or regulation change to a two-mile restriction put on our licenses for us to be able to do everything we do in our industry, which is the telcom industry. I'd like to make a recommendation that we kind of go to a mobile license which allows us to not have to pay a licensing fee each two miles that a school is registered. I would like to have consideration for a fee waiver given that our school was impacted by Hurricane Harvey, COVID, the freeze, and it has been just a tremendous uphill battle to get our school recognized and stay in compliance. I have any information that you need, commissioners or chairman would like see regarding why I'm

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                         ALLISON WILSON: Allison Wilson, Child Care
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   and Early Learning Division. This morning for your consideration
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   is the ninth tranche of child care stimulus funding initiatives.
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First is funding to support the move to paying child care providers prospectively. This is a one-time cost which is needed to modify the payment schedule for reimbursing child care programs. We currently pay providers based on enrollment, not attendance, and this will not change. We will just modify when the provider gets paid. This change was included in the Chapter 809 Child Care Final Rules that you adopted at the September  $13^{\rm th}$ meeting, and we estimate this will cost 50 million. Second is an increase of 75 million to the child care industry expansion initiative. You initially approved 75 million for this with a majority of this funding to support new startup awards for new child care programs. We've seen a huge response from entities who are interested in applying so we are requesting funding to increase the number of applications we can support. We are also requesting to extend the application deadline for employer partnership applications. These applications are the most complex and take longer to develop so we'd like to extend their application deadline to November 30, 2023, and we'd also like to extend the deadline for all programs to expend funds to no later than March 31, 2024. In the third issue, we are recommending 2.5 million to support enhancements to the Texas Early Childhood Professional Development system or TECPDS as well as to the engaged platform. Included in this is the TECPDS usability study which is based on feedback we've received about looking for opportunities to make the system more user friendly. We hope the

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results of the study can inform future system enhancements. Fourth are modifications to the amounts that we provide in the 2022 Child Care Relief Fund to account for updated information on child care deserts that TWC received from the state demographer, and to update Texas Rising Star certification status. You already approved up to 3.4 billion for the 2022 CCRF, and these changes will be funded using those existing amounts. We also recommend extending the time available for providers to expend their funds through November of 2023. And lastly, our fifth issue is requesting 500 million to provide child care services providers with a fifth Child Care Relief Fund payment. This additional one-time payment can help all CCS providers who are now required to become Texas Rising Star in improving their program's quality standards. As we transition away from the temporary enhanced reimbursement rates, this fifth payment can also serve as a one-time buffer to help in the transition back to TWC's standard reimbursement rates. That concludes my remarks, and I'm happy to answer any questions. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: None here, chairman. COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None here. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?

That's a Tuesday at 1:30 at the Hilton Anatole in Dallas, and we will have a docket as well as a few policy items. That's all that I have.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you, sir. Is there any other order of business to come before the commission?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Desi and her team for last week's successful apprenticeship conference, the sixth annual one. I

wanted to publicly acknowledge her great work and again the folks that were there and some of the conversations that took place were very meaningful and educational to the public that attended. I think the Rio Grande Valley was very grateful that we had a conference down in the area. I'd also like to thank Julia and her team for the great work that they did. Julia, thank you for that and making sure that all the things were taken care of behind the scenes so thank you.

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COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Let me echo some of the comments that have been mentioned. I also want to congratulate Bob Gear as well. Bob does a tremendous job. I love the way they handle our veterans [inaudible] so I wanted to make sure that that was known. Also, Margie Henson, I want to congratulate her. The Governor's Women's Commission are going to award certain women, outstanding women in Texas government on tomorrow and so Dr. Heather Hall on our team, and Margie is a part of her team so that will be-she'll be recognized on tomorrow at that ceremony. Also wanted to say congratulations to Desi and her team. Commissioner Alvarez, the work that you've done in the apprenticeship space to make that happen. We had a couple events in the Valley, started off with what we termed the Rally in the Valley, an internship conference on Wednesday I believe, and then that was followed by a successful apprenticeship conference on Thursday and Friday, and so you had a lot of folks in the Valley very appreciative of the fact that
