

## MEETING OF THE TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION

1 Tuesday, November 29, 2022 2 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: [Inaudible]. Public 3 comment? 4 LES TROBMAN: [Inaudible]. 5 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much. Good 6 afternoon, Ms. Miller. 7 MS. MILLER: Good afternoon, sir. 8 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. We're going to 9 take the briefest of breaks while we reset for the rest of this 10 meeting. 11 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: [Inaudible] 2022 Workforce 12 Awards. 13 JOEL MULLINS: Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman. 14 [Inaudible]. Good afternoon, Chairman Daniel, Commissioner 15 Alvarez, Commissioner Demerson, Mr. Serna. For the record, I'm 16 Joel Mullins with the Workforce Development Division. On 17 September 28, 2021, the commission approved objectively-based 18 monetary awards for Workforce Development Boards including the 19 Service to Employers Awards with the monetary award amounts of 20 \$100,000 for first place, \$75,000 for second place, and \$50,000 21 for third place. The calculation of the performance data to 22 determine the winners of the 2022 Service to Employers Award has 23 resulted in a tie for third place between two boards. Today 24 staff recommends budgeting an additional \$50,000 in Workforce

Innovation and Opportunity Act statewide funds for the Service

1 to Employers Award to allow each third-place winner to receive 2 the full award amount of \$50,000. That's all I have and I'm 3 happy to answer any questions. 4 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions? 5 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: No, thank you, Joel. COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: None here. 6 7 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 8 COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that 9 we budget an additional 50,000 in Workforce Innovation and 10 Opportunity Act statewide funds for the Service of Employers 11 Award so both third-place winners receive the full amount as 12 recommended by staff. 13 COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: Second. 14 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 15 seconded, and we are in fact unanimous. 16 JOEL MULLINS: Thank you. 17 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 9, 18 Child Care Local Match for Board Contract Year 23. 19 SANDRA WILLIAMS: Good afternoon, Chair 20 Daniel, commissioners, Mr. Serna. For the record, Sandra 21 Williams with the Workforce Development Division. The Texas 22 Workforce Commission allocates child care services funding from 23 the Child Care and Development Fund for local Workforce 24 Development Boards to, I'm sorry, for a portion of the funding. 25 Boards are required to secure and submit local matching funds to

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   TWC in accordance to federal regulations and TWC Chapter 809,
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   Child Care Services Rules, and TWC Chapter 800, Administrative
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   Rules. As noted in the discussion paper, the first BCY23 match
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   agreements are being brought forward for approval. Supporting
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   documents include 14 match agreements from five Workforce
   Development Boards which are Central Texas, Coastal Bend,
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   Dallas, Panhandle, and Texoma totaling $3,051,059. Boards have
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   secured 7.38 percent of the statewide child care local match
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   target for BCY23 with three boards securing at least 50 percent
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   of their local match and one board securing 100 percent. Staff
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   recommend accepting the child care pledges for donations,
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   transfers, and certifications of expenses for BCY23 in the
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   amount of $3,051,059.

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1 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Commissioner Demerson, it 2 occurred to me too late that while Joel was up there, while 3 technically he had spoken before a commission meeting, it was 4 never in this room. I think we [inaudible]. Next item. Let's 5 see. I'm showing nothing on Agenda Items 10 through 12. I don't see that we're having a legislative report today. Mr. Serna, an 6 7 executive director's report? MR. SERNA: Just a few brief items. First 8 9 off, I'd like to recognize our board colleagues who have joined 10 us for this very brief-interrupted their EDC meeting and joined 11 us for this very brief commission meeting here in Dallas so I 12 appreciate that very much. Second, I will say that Julia and her 13 staff have done outstanding in the preparations for not only the 14 commission meeting but the conference as well, and of course we 15 will discuss that and recognize that during the conference. I 16 did talk to Lowell because staff was already asking me if I 17 needed to authorize them to redo our commission meeting room to 18 match this one, at least the color scheme, and I told him, no, 19 that we wouldn't be doing that. We didn't have the ceiling 20 height for the chandeliers so-21 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Can we appoint a committee 22 to look into that? 23 MR. SERNA: Maybe a commission subcommittee. 24 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: We'll work on that. Mr.

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Trobman and I will work on that.

MR. SERNA: And then the last two things is just in case anybody is interested since we are here, the United States is leading Iran in the World Cup. That's a good deal. And then the very last thing is while several of our staff are here, I did want to assure the commissioners and everybody else that the majority of the staff is still at—it looks like there's a lot of people here and there are but the majority of our staff are still at their offices or working from home, but they are still conducting the state's and TWC's business. A lot of them are still doing that from here too so even though it appears that there are a lot of us that are here, things are still moving forward in case you all were just kind of curious about that. That's all I have to bring.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you, sir. Is there any other order of business to come before the commission?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I have a few remarks I'd like to make. So for those who don't know, for close to seven years I've been in this position. I had a conversation with Governor Abbott's office again this morning, and I just wanted to confirm with him and of course with you that are in attendance that I will be stepping down on December 15th of this, of March, I mean of December, and so I thought it would be appropriate that we would do this during the conference. It's been a pleasure to serve each and every one of you, the 14,000,000 working Texans of this great state, and

especially with the 28 boards that we have throughout the state of Texas. I mean it's no wonder why everybody wants to do business with us because of the great people like you. When I started in 2016 with Governor Abbott, I knew nothing about Texas Workforce Commission. As a matter of fact, when I got appointed, I was hoping it was DPS commission because I knew about that but what an honor it's been to serve with some of the greatest commissioners in this state of ours, and what a pleasure it's been to be able to represent each and every one of you. I mean the ideas, the innovation, all the great things that have come to fruition have been because of the hard work that all of you all have certainly done. The ideas that have been brought forth by my office were from stakeholder meetings back in 2016 when we were able to travel the great state of Texas and listen to stakeholders. I'd be remiss if I didn't acknowledge that it's been a pleasure to work with 28 boards, and I know we have some new ones that are joining us. And then of course we have Linda Angel who I always cringe because she has the same name as my ex-wife, so I just think that's funny, so I was [inaudible] this here. But working with Ruth and Andres who I sat back and I listened to for the time that they were here. I thought that was so beneficial for me to just step back and listen, and then of course the experience and the conversations that I had with each and every one of you allowed me to kind of express what we wanted to do, everything from converting a vacant health care

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facility in Central Texas with the school district to the colocated educational specialist to the expansion of what we do for robotics with people with a disability as we explained earlier this morning. It's just amazing what things we've done. It did take some time. As you know, my dad is going to be 81 in a couple weeks, and I look forward to working and spending a little bit more time with my father. He's the only family that I've got so, as you know, I have a place in South Texas. Whenever I go down there, I like to stay with him and spend time with my father as much as I can, but I've been very fortunate that the governor had enough trust in me to pick a young kid who just lives four miles from the local border to sit in a position where I could represent the great people of Texas. So it certainly has been a great pleasure but because I have many of you that are in this room, I'd also be remiss if I didn't acknowledge my great staff from Jason, Brent, we just hired Holly who has been a treasure to us. We have Alaina who we call the enforcer because she makes sure that we're on time on everything, and of course the addition of Jade who works with us. What a jewel she's been with a smiling face when people walk into my office. But we all know who the real commissioner of my office is and that's Jeanette Dela Cruz, and I'm super excited to have someone like her at my side. Everybody knows her and I'm just very humbled that you all allowed me an opportunity to work with these two fine gentlemen that are sitting to my right. We

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may have not always agreed on things, but we certainly respect each other. At the end of the day, that's what it's all about, is respect. So I just want to thank all of you for the great work and for working so closely with my office, and for being so innovative so with that said, I will see you at the rest of the conference but on December 15th will be my last day working for this—for the Texas Workforce Commission but who knows what's going to happen in 2024. Just thought I'd throw that in there. But we'll see what happens. Again, I look forward to working with you maybe in a different capacity, but I continue on—like I said, it's been a pleasure to represent each and every one of you and to work closely with you. To my fellow commissioners, I wish you luck and I have no doubt that whoever is in this position, you'll fully support so thank you.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Well, commissioner, that certainly deserves a response, and this is what I'd say. You mentioned that we didn't always agree because we were never supposed to. We were supposed to come to the best answer for the people of Texas, and I do have to say I have always felt like your motives were aligned with the interests of Texans and how they could really advance themselves. That's why we get into public service. I mean it's not for the rewards for ourselves. It's the reward that we get for helping people, and I certainly think you exemplified that. I thoroughly enjoyed working with you. On a personal level, we've had a great time in the brief

time that I've been here. I know that our paths will cross many more times. Our economic development roots really, I think go pretty deep, and I know that we'll have plenty of opportunities to work together, and I really look forward to that. It's been a joy and a pleasure to serve with you. Nothing's permanent in this world and we always move on to the next thing, and it's an exciting time for you and it's an exciting time to see kind of where your next path takes you and I hope that we're on that journey with you.

I will never forget the work that was done with our JET program and high-demand job training program, the TIP program and the results that we're seeing as a result of some of the things that you've done firsthand. I've been at that table to see that happen, and so commend you on that work. We'll miss you. We appreciate the work that's been done. As the chairman mentioned, it won't be goodbye forever because we'll continue to make those rounds but wanted to publicly just express my admiration and respect and appreciation for what you've done over the years to make a difference in our state, and you truly have done just that so thank you for all that you've done. COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Thank you, both of you. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any other item of business? MR. SERNA: No, sir. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Hearing that, is there a

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motion to adjourn?

COMMISSIONER ALVAREZ: Chairman, I move that we adjourn. COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: I'm going to second the motion but before that, Ed was saying that the guys are back at the office taking care of business. I ran into Chris Nelson either yesterday or the day before. Chris is glad that you guys are all gone so-MR. SERNA: I know he is. He thinks we're not spending money but we're spending it just the same here. COMMISSIONER DEMERSON: He's the chief financial officer and he basically said, no, they're gone. I'll gladly stay behind and the like, but I second that motion. CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and seconded to adjourn, and we're adjourned.
