Board Contract Year 2024 Child Care Local Match Discussion Paper

Background

The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) allocates federal funding for child care services from the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) to local workforce development areas. In accordance with federal regulations and TWC Chapter 809 Child Care Services rule §809.17(a)(1)-(2), TWC encourages Local Workforce Development Boards (Boards) to secure and submit local matching funds to TWC to receive a portion of CCDF funding.

Issue

Supporting documentation includes:

- 1 Board Contract Year 2024 (BCY'24) donation and
- 48 Board Contract Year 2024 (BCY'24) match agreements from 19 Boards (Alamo, Borderplex, Brazos Valley, Capital Area, Coastal Bend, Dallas, Deep East, Golden Crescent, Gulf Coast, Heart of Texas, Lower Rio Grande Valley, Middle Rio Grande, Northeast Texas, Rural Capital, South Texas, Southeast Texas, Tarrant County, Texoma and, West Central Texas). The Boards have secured 109.21% percent of the statewide childcare local match target for BCY'24, with all 28 Boards securing at least 100 percent of their target.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that TWC's three-member Commission accept childcare pledges for donations, transfers, and certifications of expense for BCY'24 in the amount of \$17,754,591.
