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                          Tuesday, March 5, 2024
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good morning, all. This
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   meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed up
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   for public comment?
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much. Good
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   morning, all.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: The motion passes with the
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   exceptions noted. All right, we'll take a short recess.
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                         MS.GONZALES: Thank you.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: This is Agenda Item 9,
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   Local Workforce Development Board nominees.
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                         SHUNTA WILLIAMS: Good morning, chairman,
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   commissioners, and Mr. Townsend. For the record, Shunta Williams
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   with the Workforce Development Division, and today for your
   consideration we have Workforce Board nominations for Workforce
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   Solutions in two areas, Deep East and East Texas. Staff
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   recommends approval on the presented nominees, and I'm here to
   answer any questions you may have.
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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, any comments or
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   questions?

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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?
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                         COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move to
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   approve the local Workforce Development Board member nominees
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presented today for the following: Workforce Solutions Deep East Texas and East Texas.

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COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I second.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and seconded, and the vote is unanimous. Thank you. This is Agenda Item 10, Child Care Match.

LISA GUZMAN: Good morning, commissioners, Mr. Townsend. For the record, Lisa Guzman, Workforce Development Division. In accordance with federal regulations and TWC Chapter 809, Child Care Services rule, TWC encourages the boards to secure and submit local matching funds to TWC in order to receive a portion of the CCDF funding. Supporting documentation includes one BCY24 donation and 41 BCY24 match agreements from 19 boards: Alamo, Borderplex, Brazos Valley, Capital Area, Coastal Bend, Dallas, Deep East, Golden Crescent, Gulf Coast, Heart of Texas, Lower Rio, Middle Rio, Northeast Texas, Rural Capital, South Texas, Southeast Texas, Tarrant County, Texoma, and West Central totaling \$17,754,591. Boards have secured 109.21 percent of the statewide child care local match target for BCY24 with all 28 boards securing at least 100 percent of their target. Staff is recommending that TWC accept child care pledges for donations, transfers, and certifications for expenses for BCY24 in the amount of \$17,754,591. Happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here. 1 2 COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions. 3 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion? 4 COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move to 5 approve the acceptance of child care pledges for donations, 6 transfers, and certifications of expense for Board Contract Year 7 2024 in the amount of \$17,754,591 as recommended today by staff. COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I second. 8 9 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and 10 seconded, and the vote is unanimous. Thank you. I believe we do 11 have a legislative report today. Michael Britt is here, 12 resplendent tie and a four-in-hand knot, perfect pleat. I mean. 13 MICHAEL BRITT: Good morning. I understood 14 there was an imposter the last couple of weeks so I needed to 15 come secure my spot. 16 CHAIRMAN DANIEL: I'm glad you're here to 17 defend your territory. 18 MICHAEL BRITT: Good morning, Mr. Chairman, 19 commissioners, and Mr. Townsend. For the record, Michael Britt, 20 Governmental Relations. Last week the U.S. Congress passed and 21 the president signed House Resolution 7463, the Extension of 22 Continuing Appropriations and Other Matters Act of 2024. This 23 bill extends funding for the federal government beyond the 24 previous March 1st and March 8th deadlines for funding titles that 25 were previously set to expire on March 8th which includes the

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   Labor, Health and Human Services and Education title. Funding
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   has now been extended until March 22, 2024. As they move forward
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   on their budget matters, Congress must pass all the
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   appropriation titles by April 30, 2024. Under current law, if
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   Congress relies on a continuing resolution to fund the federal
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   government beyond that date, a one percent across-the-board
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   reduction in federal appropriations will go into effect. Also,
   GR will be monitoring joint committees of the U.S. House and
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   Senate Veterans Affairs committees where they will be hearing
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   legislative priorities from veteran service organizations, and
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   these hearings will be taking place both at 9:00 a.m. on
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   Wednesday and Thursday of this week. This concludes my remarks.

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                         CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there an executive
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   director's report today.
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                         MR. TOWNSEND: Good morning, chairman,
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   commissioners. Yes, sir. We have two updates for you this
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   morning. The first, I'm going to have Chris Nelson come up and
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give you an update on where we are on the budget status for our vocational rehabilitation program.

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CHRIS NELSON: Good morning, chairman, commissioners. For the record, Chris Nelson, chief financial officer. This morning I'm going to give you an update on an item previously briefed with your offices. With an increased level of client services in the vocational rehabilitation program, TWC has looked at opportunities to increase the amount of federal funding available to the VR program. Through the course of its review, staff identified that TWC is overmatched in its child care program by approximately \$27,000,000 due to COVID FMAP adjustments provided through federal legislation. During this same period as TWC continues to close out its federal COVID child care funding, we have identified some ARPA child care funds that will not be spent on the projects previously approved and will be available for use in our normal subsidized child care program. These ARPA funds must be spent by September 30, 2024, and will allow TWC to serve more children than the 144,000 per day we are currently serving. On February 2nd of this year, TWC submitted a letter in accordance with TWC Rider 33 to the Legislative Budget Board and the Office of the Governor notifying them 30 days in advance of TWC's intent to transfer \$25,000,000 in child care general revenue to the vocational rehab program. This would allow TWC to draw down an additional 92.4 million dollars in VR federal funds in support for the

delivery of VR services. TWC briefed staff with the Legislative Budget Board, the Office of the Governor, and other legislative offices after submitting this letter. On Monday, TWC met the 30-day period and at this time plans to proceed with the transfer as specified in Rider 33, our Rider 33 letter. That concludes my update. I'd be happy to answer any questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any questions or comments?

COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Thank you, Mr.

Nelson. No comments.

COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions.

CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, thank you.

MR. TOWNSEND: The other update, just wanted to let you know that the governor is presenting an update on the Texas wildfires later this morning, and I just wanted you to know that TWC staff, particularly unemployment insurance and workforce divisions, are closely monitoring the situation and making sure that we're staying on top of that so just wanted you to be aware of the activity we're taking here at the Workforce Commission.

I suspected as much. I mean unfortunately our job doesn't come into play until after the fact, and there's been an incredible amount of damage both to people's homes, a lot of businesses, tremendous amount of livestock. I'm not even sure we have a full

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   accounting of what's been lost so do keep us apprised of what
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   we're able to do to help.
