2	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Good afternoon, everyone.
3	This meeting is called to order. Mr. Trobman, has anyone signed
4	up for public comment?
5	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you very much. Good
6	afternoon.
7	MS. MILLER: Good afternoon.
8	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Thank you. We'll take a
9	short recess.
10	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right, this is Agenda
11	Item 9, proposed rule reviews for 40 TAC Chapter 800, Chapter
12	802, and Chapter 811.
13	REED O'BRIEN: Good afternoon, Chairman
14	Daniel, Commissioner Treviño, Commissioner Esparza, and Mr.
15	Serna. For the record, I'm Reed O'Brien with the Office of
16	General Counsel. Texas Government Code, Section 2001.039,
17	requires state agencies to review their rules every four years
18	to consider each rule for readoption, revision or repeal, and to
19	determine whether the reasons for adopting the rules continues
20	to exist. Additionally, staff's assessment includes determining
21	whether the rules are obsolete, whether they reflect the current
22	legal and policy considerations, and whether they reflect the
23	commission's current procedures. Commissioners, before you today
23 24	commission's current procedures. Commissioners, before you today for your consideration for approval are notices of TWC's intent

1	Administrative Code: Chapter 800, General Administration;
2	Chapter 802, Integrity of the Texas Workforce System; and
3	Chapter 811, Choices. Staff recommends submitting the notices of
4	intent to review the rules for publication in the Texas Register
5	for a 30-day public comment period and after the comment period
6	ends, staff will present the results of the rule review
7	assessments, and this concludes my presentation, and I'm glad to
8	answer any questions you may have.
9	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions?
10	COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.
11	COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions.
12	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?
13	COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move we
14	approve the proposed rule reviews for 40 Texas Administrative
15	Code, Chapter 800, General Administration, Chapter 802,
16	Integrity of the Texas Workforce System, and Chapter 811,
17	Choices, for publication for public comment as recommended today
18	by staff.
19	COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I second.
20	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and
21	seconded, and the motion carries. This is Agenda Item 10, Mid-
22	Year Review of Local Workforce Development Board Child Care
23	Allocations and Targets for Board Contract Year 2024.
24	REAGAN MILLER: Good afternoon, chairman,
25	commissioners. I'm Reagan Miller with the Child Care & Early

1 Learning Division. This afternoon we're bringing forward the mid-year review with BCY24 child care targets and allocations. 2 3 This mid-year review provides an opportunity for us to recheck 4 the case mix and cost factors that we use to determine the 5 affordable number of kids that our boards can serve. We looked at a couple of things specifically. As we implement the new 6 7 requirements for all child care services providers to provide 8 Texas Rising Star certified, the average cost of child care will 9 increase as these providers begin to qualify for the enhanced 10 reimbursement rates. We also examined the policy change that 11 will go into effect with the new child care case management 12 system that launches on July 1st. This change will result in 13 child care providers being paid the reimbursement rate of the 14 workforce area that they are located in rather than the 15 workforce area that the child is located in. That aligns with 16 how our market rates survey determines those reimbursement 17 costs. Based on our review there are 21 boards whose average 18 cost has increased and we are recommending the distribution of 19 \$20,986,281 to allow them to meet their initially approved 20 targets. The remaining seven boards can afford to serve a total 21 of 327 additional average kids per day, and we are recommending 22 adjustments to their targets. All of these details are laid out 23 on Attachment 1 of the discussion paper. We're also recommending 24 that you authorize staff to conduct a year-end reconciliation to 25 ensure that board's average cost did not increase to a point

1	that made their BCY24 target unaffordable and distribute funding
2	to boards whose average cost increases would mean that they
3	wouldn't have a sufficient amount of funding to meet their
4	contracted approved target, and I'd be happy to answer any
5	questions.
6	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Any comments or questions?
7	COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.
8	COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No questions.
9	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion?
10	COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: Chairman, I move we
11	approve an additional Board Contract Year 2024 child care
12	allocation distribution of \$20,986,281 to 21 boards, increase
13	certain boards' performance targets, and authorize staff to
14	conduct a year-end reconciliation as described in the discussion
15	paper and presented today by staff.
16	COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: I second.
17	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and
18	seconded, and the motion carries.
19	REAGAN MILLER: Thank you.
20	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: All right. No legislative
21	report today. Is there an executive director's report?
22	MR. SERNA: Yes, sir. One quick item. Just
23	want to let the commissioners know that we received notice of a
24	DOL grant opportunity to help support individuals who are
25	reentering the workforce coming out of the justice system. This

1	is different than the previous grant, the PROWD grant, in that
2	this is focused on state and county facilities and not federal
3	facilities. Potential grant awarded between one and four
4	million, and the services provided are to assist individuals in
5	job search and job acquisition so we'll work with local boards
6	to determine how many of those boards want to participate, and
7	then we'll submit a grant. So I just wanted to give you a heads-
8	up that we'll continue to work towards that. This fits with our
9	instruction from the commission that that's a focus area for us
10	so that's all I have to report, Mr. Chairman.
11	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Ed, I have a request. I
12	understand there will be an annual meeting later this year. In
13	years past we've presented awards that were cash awards. I'm
14	interested in taking a look at rethinking awards maybe to do a
15	better job of incentivizing innovative activities that boards
16	are doing. Can you please ask staff to bring forward a
17	discussion paper to establish some innovation fund boards could
18	use to apply for to get money to do innovative things, things
19	that might not be otherwise contained in the contract that would
20	benefit workforce in Texas, and to do this in lieu of the
21	monetary awards?
22	MR. SERNA: Yes, sir. We'll do that. We'll
23	get right on that.
24	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there any other order
25	of business to come before the commission?

1	COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: No, sir.
2	COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: None here.
3	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: Is there a motion to
4	adjourn?
5	COMMISSIONER TREVIÑO: I move to adjourn.
6	COMMISSIONER ESPARZA: Second.
7	CHAIRMAN DANIEL: It's been moved and
8	seconded to adjourn and we're adjourned.
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
