Subject: Plumbing Profession—*Update*

PURPOSE:

To provide Local Workforce Development Boards (Boards) with **updated**:

- information regarding licensing requirements for plumbers;
- available statistical data on the plumbing profession; and
- links to the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners (TSBPE) and Board websites.

This updated WD Letter provides information regarding statistics on:

- wage information;
- current employment;
- estimated employment; and
- projected job growth.

BACKGROUND:

Texas Occupations Code §1301.652 requires that TSBPE and the Texas Workforce Commission "shall, through the local workforce development boards, coordinate efforts to educate the public about the plumbing profession and the resources available to employers for the recruitment and training of plumbers."

PROCEDURES:

<u>NLF</u>: Boards must ensure that the following information regarding State of Texas plumbing license requirements, statistical data on the plumbing profession, and links to pertinent websites is available in their local workforce development areas.

<u>NLF</u>: Boards must also ensure that appropriate staff is aware of and complies with the requirements in this WD Letter.

State Licensing Requirements

Texas Occupations Code §1301.351 states that "A person may not engage in the business of plumbing unless:

- the person holds a license or endorsement under this chapter: or
- the person's work is supervised and controlled by a person licensed under this chapter."

TSBPE develops and administers the plumbing license exam that applicants must pass to receive a license. Additionally, TSBPE offers a review course in English and Spanish to assist in preparing for the exam. All licenses issued by TSBPE are subject to following requirements:

- Payment of an annual renewal fee; and
- Completion of at least six hours of continuing professional education per year-; and
- Proof of required insurance coverage.
